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1 Introduction

It is our policy that all students in Year 7 to Year 11 should wear a school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours, unless exempted from doing so by the Headteacher on designated days. We provide a complete list of the items needed for school uniform in this uniform policy and on our website. Effective teaching and learning requires organisation, and this starts with a smart and tidy appearance which helps to instill discipline and pride in students' appearance and reduces the risk of distraction in lessons.

2 Aims and Objectives

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform;

- promotes a sense of identity and pride for students attending the school;
- engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes students feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money by most parents;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind

3 Roles and responsibilities

3.1 The Local Governing Body

- Monitors and reviews the school uniform policy.
- Seeks the views of parents to ensure they agree with and support the policy.
- Requires the Headteacher to report to the Governing body on the implementation of the policy.

3.2 Headteacher and Senior Leadership Team

- To implement and monitor the policy on a day-to-day basis.
- Have overall responsibility for ensuring standards are maintained.
- Are responsible, along with the relevant Head of Year of Year/Pastoral Support Workers and the wider staff team, for any disciplinary measures required for failing to follow the uniform rules and will contact parents/carers as required.
- Consider any requests from parents for special dispensation with regard to uniform

3.3 Staff

- Support the Leadership Team in maintaining high standards of uniform dress.
- Are role models in the wearing of appropriate clothing.
- Make discreet and sympathetic enquiries when students fail to wear correct school uniform.
- Are aware of students whose standard of dress may indicate care issues at home and report concerns to the appropriate persons (see Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy).
- Are responsible, along with the relevant Head of Year of Year/Pastoral Support Workers for any disciplinary measures required for failing to follow the uniform rules and will contact parents/carers as required.
- Give positive encouragement to students setting good examples of dress.

3.4 Parents/Carers

- Support the School Uniform Policy.
- Ensure their students are appropriately dressed, wearing correct uniform and are ready to learn.
- Ensure that they keep their child's school uniform clean and in good condition.

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3.5 Students

- Wear correct school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours.
- Wear their uniform with pride.
- Keep their uniform clean and tidy.
- Remember to bring PE kit on the correct days.

4 Uniform Expectations

4.1 All Students

4.1.1 General uniform

- Navy Blue Blazer to display LHS logo
- School Skirt must be at least 20", dark grey or charcoal, pleated with a plain panel at the top with the school logo. Black tights (Minimum 60 denier) must be worn with a skirt. Socks are not permitted to be worn over tights, OR
- School trousers must be dark grey or charcoal tailored trousers, worn full length to the ankle.
 - Leggings, footless tights, skinny fit and stretch trousers or jeans are <u>not permitted</u>
- Plain white button-up shirt, short or long sleeves
- School tie (colour dependent on year group) to be worn with 5 stripes visible (and no more than 5cm above the waist), worn over a white, buttoned, collared shirt, with top button done up
- Grey V-neck jumper or tank top to display the school logo (Burgundy jumper may be worn by Year 11 students)
- Plain black shoes.
 - No canvas shoes. No trainers, sports shoe brands such as Adidas, Nike, Converse, or Puma. No shell toe pumps. No boots, including 'Kicker' boots.

4.1.2 Shoes

- School shoes must be plain black school shoes made of a polishable material. We do not permit high boots, ankle boots or high visibility buckles/bows/coloured laces/logos etc. Please note that trainers or canvas shoes are not acceptable
- For examples of the types of footwear that are and are not permissible please see the example pages below.

4.1.3 School Sports Kit

- Either Shorts navy and sky blue shorts with school logo to be worn with navy football socks. OR Tracksuit trousers navy with school logo or plain black shorts (no visible logo). Leggings plain navy
- Hoodie/Crew neck sweater (optional) navy and sky blue hoodie or navy crew neck sweatshirt both with school logos
- Socks navy football socks to be worn with shorts.
- Trainers/football boots
- Long hair must be tied back
- GCSE dance kit as the PE kit. Suitable dance shoes, no trainers.

4.1.4 Jewellery

- Wrist watch can be worn but no smart watches.
- No piercings are permitted no earrings, nose studs, tongue studs or other facial piercings.
- Plasters or retainers of any kind are not permitted to worn to cover a piercing.
- No other jewellery can be worn

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4.1.5 Make-up

- Make-up must be discreet and natural with no false eyelashes or extreme eyebrows
- No nail varnish, gels or acyclic or false nails

4.1.6 Hair

- No extreme hair styles such as shaved patterns or stripes.
- Hair should not be unnatural in colour.
- Hair accessories should be plain black, navy or grey.
- Head scarves should be plain navy.
- No large bows or hair accessories may be worn.

5 Guidelines

It is expected that all students wear the school uniform each school day with the appropriate footwear.

If a student does not wear the correct uniform, a 15-minute form tutor detention will be issued and a verbal reminder of our expectations will be communicated to the student. If failure to wear the correct uniform is identified as a persistent issue, parents/carers will be contacted. The student will also be provided with uniform to wear. Refusal from the student to do this will result in the student being placed in Internal exclusion for the remainder of that day.

If a student arrives at school without the full correct uniform with communication from parents/carers, the missing item will be provided by the school for them to wear, with the expectation that the issue will be resolved the following day. If the school does not have the missing item available, a note will be issued to the student for that day only.

Students are responsible for taking care of their own school uniform and that borrowed from school. Students who repeatedly come to school without the correct school uniform maybe placed in the Internal Exclusion room (Reflect) and parents/carers will be asked to attend a meeting in school to resolve the issue.

6 Discipline

The Headteacher has the legal authority to discipline students for not wearing correct school uniform (see www.gov.uk/school-discipline-exclusions). In extreme cases a student could be excluded for persistently failing to wear school uniform. It is our intention to explore all avenues, through consultation and discussion with parents/carers, to avoid this sanction being taken. If a student arrives not wearing the correct uniform

school will endeavour to find the cause and remedy the situation. A letter will be sent home to parents. Should the problem persist, parents/carers may be invited into school to discuss the situation.

7 Help with Cost

If any parent/carer cannot provide their student with school uniform because they cannot afford it, financial help may be available. School uniform may include clothes for PE. The parent/carer should initially talk to the Head of Year or the senior leader link.

8 Lost Property

Any unidentified items of school uniform will be placed in boxes in the Lost Property at the main school office. Students are encouraged to look in these boxes to reclaim lost property on the understanding that the found item will be clearly named.
