## Student Leadership/ School Council and Charity

## DRAMA SHOWCASE



On bonfire night of this academic year, the Year 11 GCSE Drama learners performed their devised pieces as part of their GCSE Drama examinations. After 6 months with no drama lessons, the learners worked tirelessly to get their pieces ready for the performance. There were 3 pieces overall which tackled various hard-hitting subjects. The year 11s performed their work with fantastic and mature attitudes and as their teacher, I couldn't be prouder. The first piece told the story of an abusive religious cult, which manipulated young people into joining their beliefs. Done in the style of Physical Theatre, it explored the notion and vulnerability of war veterans, domestic abuse victims

and miscarriage sufferers. Piece number 2 was a tribute to the world's emergency services and the fantastic things they do across the globe. It told the stories of how emergency services reacted to a school shooting, the 9/11 disaster, domestic abuse, knife crime and the Manchester arena tragedy. Also done in the style of Physical Theatre. The final piece was a Brechtian style performance about protests throughout time. A informational and interesting piece about the Suffragettes, the Nazi Regime, LGBTQ rights and the March for Our Lives cause. All the learners handled these topics with confidence and maturity well above their ages. A huge thankyou to their teachers who came to support them in the absence of family and friends who unfortunately couldn't attend due to the current restrictions.

### Presentation Evening 2020 - Class of 2020



The class of 2020 had a very unusual end to their life at Longdendale. Unfortunately, the class of 2020 not only had their opportunity to take their GCSE examinations taken away from them, their chance to celebrate their success was also interrupted. Not being content to let our class of 2020 finish their time at Longdendale with a whimper, we pioneered a brand new, virtual Open Evening Presentation. A great deal of staff worked tirelessly to prepare the presentations, order certificates, prizes and trophies, and to collate everything together into an amazing presentation evening. We celebrated the success of all our Year 11 learners as well as celebrating the success of learners who excelled

academically in different subject areas, and those who made the most progress within individual subjects. We had some excellent musical performances from some of our Class of 2020 and a moving message from their Learning Leader, Mrs Moffat. We hope all our Class of 2020 enjoyed the presentation evening and we wish them all the best in their future success.

#### Gateways Programme with The University of Manchester



A selection of learners within each year group are being chosen to enrol on the Gateways Programme in collaboration with The University of Manchester. The programme traditionally involves a visit to the university each academic year, where the learners engage in a variety of activities including financial guidance, interactive workshops with University standard equipment, debates and learning opportunities. The programme provides an opportunity for learners who come from families / areas which are underrepresented at University to gain the confidence and aspirations that they can be a success and go to University. We have

held sessions for Year 8 and 10 so far and look forward to Year 7 and 9 in 2021. Unfortunately, at the moment learners cannot attend a visit to the university. However, as soon as the national picture improves, all learners selected for this programme will be offered the opportunity to visit The University of Manchester in 2021.

#### National Tutoring Programme



Learners in Year 11 who meet the criteria nationally, have been selected to engage in a programme of online tuition in English, Maths or Science. Our learners have been enrolled into at least two of these subject areas depending on their need. This is an amazing opportunity for these learners to access online tuition. The programme started in December 2020 and will continue until Easter 2021. The tuition is completely free for our learners, something which can often cost £30 or more per session. Our learners will have 15 sessions per subject!

company we are working with have an excellent track record of improving leaner progress by up to 6 months during their tuition. We look forward to watching our learners make rapid progress, increase their confidence and ultimately, achieve higher standards in their upcoming GCSE examinations in 2021.

# CAREERS

## Life After Longdendale



The Covid restrictions have meant that we haven't been able to run our usual programme of events to support Year 11 learners around planning their options after leaving Longdendale in the same way. However, in October we were able to facilitate a College Focus Week in the place of our annual Futures Roadshow. The local colleges sent recorded assemblies, presentations, virtual links to open evenings, college prospectuses and even the most sought after freebies in to school for our learners. In tutor time, the learners were given the opportunity to access all of this information and discuss the various options open to them after they leave Longdendale. Feedback from the event was really positive, with many learners identifying that the week's activities prompted them to investigate local colleges and to start completing their applications.

All of the materials shared with learners are available on the school website under Careers and Guidance. We have planned a similar approach to supporting learners with applying for apprenticeships in the new year. ### **Virtual Careers Events**



This term we have also been able to run careers events for our Year 9 and Year 10 learners, although these too have been delivered virtually.

Year 9 attended a World of Work workshop; they had the opportunity to hear from people in various professions and what a typical day in their job was like. Learners could then submit

questions to find out more about any of the jobs they were interested in. Year 10 attended a Work Preparation workshop, hearing from variuous employers about how to be successful in an interview.

Again, learners were given the opportunity to submit their questions to the employers. Learners commented that they were grateful for the opportunity to hear from different employers and how they could best impress potential employers at an interview.

## REWARDS

When faced with the uncertainty and disruption caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, it is easy for schools to let recognition fall by the wayside, but it has never been more essential to keep our learners motivated and to recognise their efforts for a job well done.

At Longdendale High School we are proud to have continued to reward learners with achievement points, which is something that can easily be done whether working remotely or from within the classroom. We were particularly keen this year to ensure that no learner was disadvantaged by having to work from home when self-isolating.



We have continued with our much-coveted reward postcards and have introduced some new designs this year. We also have a virtual option that can be emailed to learners, or a stringently Covid-friendly hand-over of a physical postcard (with plenty of hand sanitiser, of course) so it can be brought home and put on the fridge for all to see. As staff, we love the excitement a postcard brings to a learner when they have wowed us and earned one!

Of course, the weekly rewards have also changed to comply with Covid-19 restrictions: moving from cinema vouchers (as Cineworld temporarily closed) to a pick n mix movie deal for delivery straight to home; ensuring lunch time jump the queue passes are bubble friendly - just to mention a couple of the adaptations made, with something for everyone's tastes.





It has been a joy to provide learners with the chance to celebrate Learning Leader and Head teacher awards within their year groups and we have seen a surge in the number of these awarded by staff since returning in September. Longdendale Learners are quite evidently keen to get back in the swing of things and make up for lost learning time.

At Christmas and Easter, learners who have consistently met expectations are invited by their Learning Leaders to join us on a year group reward trip. Despite the current regional context, this has not fallen by the wayside either. Learners who qualify will be rewarded with an in-house treat.

In the last week of this term, we will reward subject successes in year group assemblies. Although we cannot all come together as a community in the sports hall in the usual way there will be many opportunities to celebrate what we have accomplished as a school since September.

Since feeling connected is something most of us are missing right now, it is especially important to give rewards a sense of community, where members of our school community can reward each other or get rewarded collectively. We will be launching Praise Postcards to give learners and staff the chance to say thank you whether it is to someone who has supported them over a period of time or for something small that made a difference to their day.

#### **Mrs Emery Recommends**



This book was recommended to me by Mrs Willis when I was compiling the department reading lists. She told me this book would be great for our learners who want to develop their resilience, and told me I would love it if I read it. So this half term I decided I would read it. It was amazing. This book is narrated in the voice of Melody, an 11 year old girl who suffers with cerebral palsy. Melody cannot speak, or move her body. Her only means of communication is through blinking. Doctors gave up on her

when she was 5 years old and told her parents they could move on with their lives if they put her into a nursing home. But Melody's parents knew she was clever, and that they would never give up on her. This story is heart warming, emotional and uplifting all in the same breath. It makes you reconsider your own outlook on life, and if you've ever said something is too hard, you can't do it, or given up on something you've found difficult, then Melody's story will change your life. Just see what she is able to achieve, despite her many barriers. A must read for all young people in my eyes!

#### **Miss Wither Recommends**



I am enjoying this book; the character Lucy Gray is a compelling love interest for Snow, and reminds me of a less tamed, more secretive Katniss. I haven't finished the book yet, but I would recommend, as it's an enjoyable read. However, it hasn't got the same sense of realism and grit as The Hunger Games, in my opinion, so this makes it seem a little less adult and believable to me. This book appealed to me immediately as a twin. It tells the story of Noah and Jude-teenage twins who allow love, life and tragedy growing up to tear their relationship apart. Jude and Noah's instinctive understanding of one another their ability to communicate with just a look and the games the play as children that exclude the rest of the world feel very familiar to me!

Overall, I'd say this book has an awful lot of heart- perhaps too much for some- it's a deep exploration of the twins' harrowing and emotional experiences growing up. It definitely deals with more adult teenage experiences and would be more appropriate for older readers who enjoy exploring the emotions, stresses and strains of growing up.

This book is on our recommending reading lists for Mental Health and Well-being, but has strong links to Art too. Art, painting and sculpture are beautifully written and described throughout the novel and if this theme is of interest to you it is definitely worth a read. # GEOGRAPHY

## Geographer of the Year Competition

Over the course of the last six months many learners have risen to new the challenges of online learning in the Geography Department at Longdendale High School. We wanted to use this opportunity to share some of their outstanding work with you.

During the summer term, eight KS3 learners participated in a competition by the Royal Geographical Society on the theme "The World Beyond My Window". Learners used their geographical skills to research their local area and explain how they are connected to this area. The learners created outstanding, hand drawn maps and images to illustrate their excellent posters. Aimee, Emily, Finlay, Jamie-Leigh, Jack, Jake, Lottie and Seth were amongst the learners who submitted fantastic pieces of work.



Jack (Y9) prepared a poster on how the physical geography of a region can affect windsurfing conditions and how windsurfing can provide economic opportunities for local communities.

Emily (Y9) explained the location and historical relevance of Dovestone reservoir. Emily's poster also stresses the importance of reservoirs and other places of recreation for people during lockdown and the COVID-19 pandemic.





Aimee (Y9) completed outstanding research on local reservoirs. She explained how the reservoirs were created in the 19th century to provide water for Greater Manchester. Aimee reminds us of the importance of avoiding water and air pollution so that future generations will be able to enjoy the beauty of our local area.

Jake (Y9) prepared an outstanding poster on wildlife in the Peak District. He explains how species such as the hare have adapted to the local biomes of the Peak District National Park. Jake also reminds us of the importance of protecting these species through conservation efforts and sustainable tourism in the area. He explains why the Treak Cliff cavern attracts many visitors.
