#### CAREERS, EDUCATION, INFORMATION & GUIDANCE



As part of their CEIAG provision this term, our Year 11 students had the opportunity to complete a carousel of events to set them up for their next steps beyond GCSEs and Longdendale High School. As part of the Enrichment and Aspirations Day, the experience included a virtual workshop on budgeting skills and an in-house workshop on revision skills, both thanks to GM Higher. Students worked with the Year 11 tutor team to complete a WebQuest researching local colleges and courses in readiness for open days and college applications; a session on Apprenticeships from the ASK Programme alongside a Xello Assignment and a Personal Statement session.


Year 11 have also been able to explore their options for transition to KS5 through the Futures Roadshow. This enabled them to access virtual presentations from 8 local colleges and provided them with the opportunity to meet with post-16 providers on-site. It was fantastic to give them chance to explore a mix of apprenticeships and college options, meet the RAF/Army/Navy as well as the National Citizenship Service and to get face-to-face answers to the many questions they had about their futures.

Upcoming events will include embedding Xello as a CEIAG application for all year groups. Years 8 -11 should already have their log-ins from last academic year and are able to access their accounts to start to get themselves careers ready. Please look out for further details next term.

#### **ANTI-BULLYING WEEK/KINDNESS PLEDGES**

For Anti-Bullying Week 2021 our ambassadors focussed on how we can continue working together as a community to prevent bullying. In order to raise awareness of all the good work they do around school, they promoted Odd Socks Day, handed out fliers with information on how to seek support and created thoughtful activities for tutor time. They also refreshed students' memories on how to report bullying through the SafeWatch button on the website and placed a box in the LRC for students to request a catch-up with one of the Anti-Bullying Ambassador team.

The theme for this year was 'One Kind Word'. With this in mind, students created a Kindness Pledge in their tutor groups and participated in a drop down session where they took a fresh look at kindness to find out if it's possible to disagree in a kind manner.

#### **CITY INSPIRES**



In September the school started offering a developmental programme provided by Manchester City Football Club. The purpose of City Inspires is to provide young people with essential life skills with a focus on improving their prosocial behaviour and mental-wellbeing. It's provided a real boost to all the students who have participated on the programme so far. Currently, we have a Year 8 and a Year 10 cohorts. The Year 10 cohort will run for the entire academic year, the Year 8 students will finish at February half-term when a Year 9 group start. The course consists of some classroom activities followed by an hour of physical activity every other Thursday.

The current students have engaged very positively and their confidence, social skills and physical health is already benefiting. The coach assigned to Longdendale, Ryan, has said that he is delighted with the engagement of the children on the course, he's really enjoying running the sessions and watching them develop. The students have recently received their first free merchandise – a Manchester City top. There are further treats on the way both in school and out and we hope to have a visit to the Etihad soon.

The Year 9 students who are going to start the course in February will be notified shortly after the Christmas break.

#### YEAR 11 GCSE DRAMA SHOWCASE



On the 4th November this academic year, the Year 11 GCSE Drama students performed their devised pieces in front of a live audience as part of their GCSE Drama examinations. After a turbulent 6 months of working on these pieces, with absences, isolations and illnesses, the students worked tirelessly to get their pieces ready for the performance. There were 4 pieces overall which tackled various hard-hitting subjects. The Year 11s performed their work with fantastic and mature attitudes and as their teacher, I couldn't be prouder.

The first piece was called Trauma de Bello and focused on the struggles and hardships that men and women went through during WW2. It looked at the effect of shell shock, loss, pride and fear. The imagery displayed played respect to the sacrifices soldiers and their loved ones endured during this important part of history.

Piece number 2, entitled Powerful Women looked at 4 different examples of strong influential women throughout history. The piece aimed to inform audience members about the struggles, battles and discrimination that women have and still endure. Through the case studies shown, the audience began to understand why these women are so influential and inspirational. Piece number 3, called Unsolved Mysteries focused on 5 famous case studies of mysterious circumstances of murder, kidnapping and disappearances. The performance included facts and information to allow the audience to ponder the circumstances around these mysteries.

The final piece was called Holocaust Unheard and told the stories of various people who were involved in the tragic Holocaust during WW2. It focused on various parts of this section of history and how the events effected people's lives. The imagery aimed to tell the audience about these individual stories in an effort to pay respect to their experiences.

All the students handled these topics with confidence and maturity well above their ages. A huge thankyou to their parents, friends, family and teachers who came to support the students on their first live performance as GCSE students.



#### **MATHS WEEK**



At the beginning of November, Longdendale celebrated Maths Week England! Students experienced maths in lots of their subjects. In English lessons, students looked at the data behind headlines and used the same data to re-write them. In Music students looked at how many times a chord would be played in a song if it had 4 beats per bar and History looked at Roman numerals. In the maths department we had lots going on. There was a coded message around school for students to work out the missing words and a design a Mathematical Mr Man which we had some amazing entries for. We couldn't pick just one winner, to the left are our top five entries chosen by the department.

In the department we attended some online events including looking at some puzzles in the Nrich webinar. We saw how we can use maths to save the planet in the Maths Inspiration webinar by looking at how fast the arctic is melting and predicting when it might completely disappear, finding out how much CO2 we are each using per year and how much we could save by going vegan, not going on a flight or taking a cold shower once per week (you could save a lot of CO2 by going vegan for a year but then undo it all by taking a return flight to Greece!). We looked at the challenges faced with space travel and the solutions by using geometry and equations of motion along with reasoning and problem solving skills in the AMSP webinar.

In lessons we also looked at visualising inequality by looking at how we would distribute wealth in a school and then in the UK and then saw how it was actually distributed in the UK and around the world (the UK seemed much fairer!).



The week also saw the Senior Maths Challenge take place for 30 Year 11 students. We had some fantastic results with two silver and six bronze certificates. Well done to all those who took part!

Staff didn't miss out with a sudoku given to every member of staff to encourage them to take 5 minutes and enjoy completing a puzzle. They also had a rather difficult maths challenge to complete from our Head Boy, Louis.

We hope the students have seen how maths is so important in so many different aspects of the world around us and have used their reasoning, problem solving and communication skills. Follow us on Twitter doing in the maths department.


