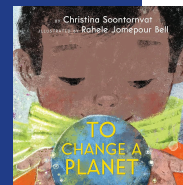

Communication and Language

- Learn new vocabulary in different contexts.
- Connect one idea or action to another using a range of connectives-
- Retell the story, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text.
- Engage in non-fiction books.
- Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories
- Express their ideas and feelings about change and their experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses.

Physical Development

- Know and talk different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing.
- Further develop and refine a range of ball skills including: throwing, catching, kicking, passing,
- Be independent as they get dressed and undressed
- Continue to develop handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient
- Develop confidence, competence, precision and accuracy when engaging in activities that involve a ball.
- Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing - using the tripod grip in almost all cases.
- Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery.
