1. Ellie and the Cat

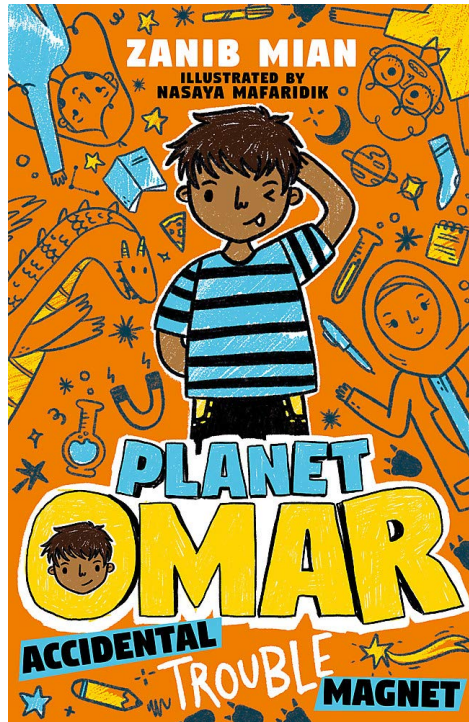

2. Planet Omar: Unexpected Trouble Magnet

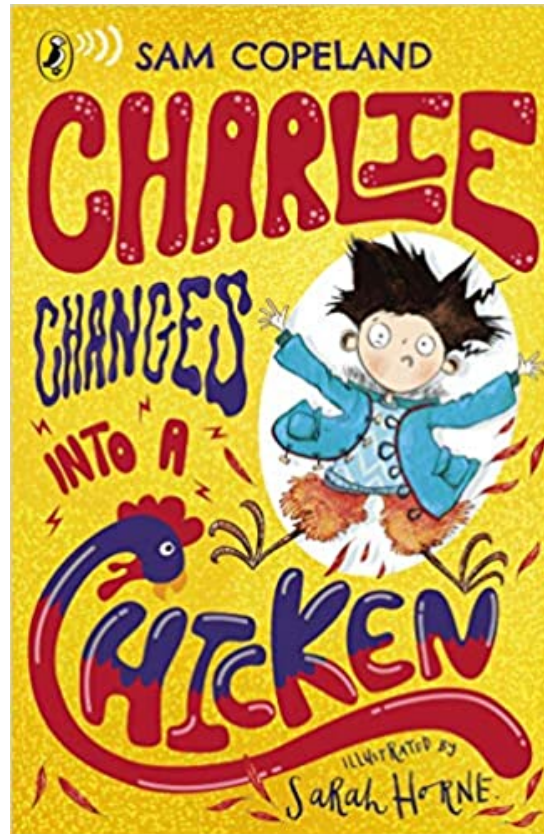

3. Charlie Changes into a Chicken

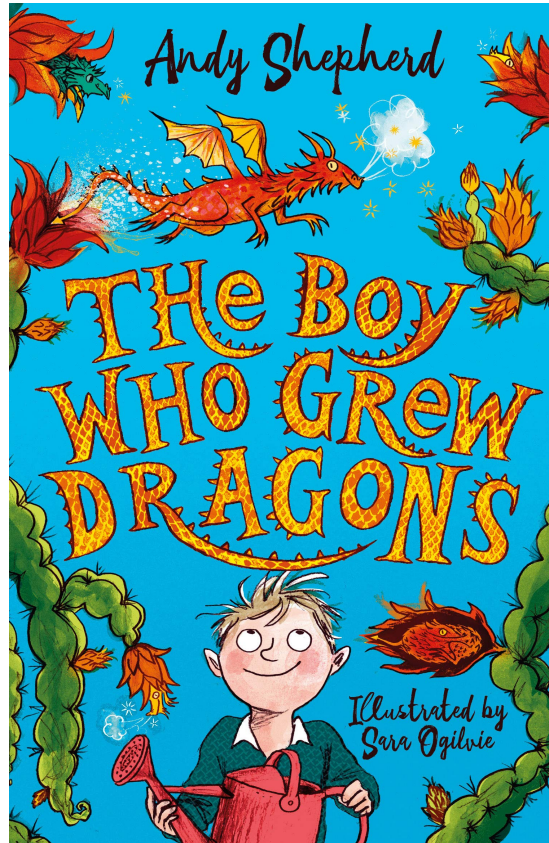

4. The Boy Who Grew Dragons

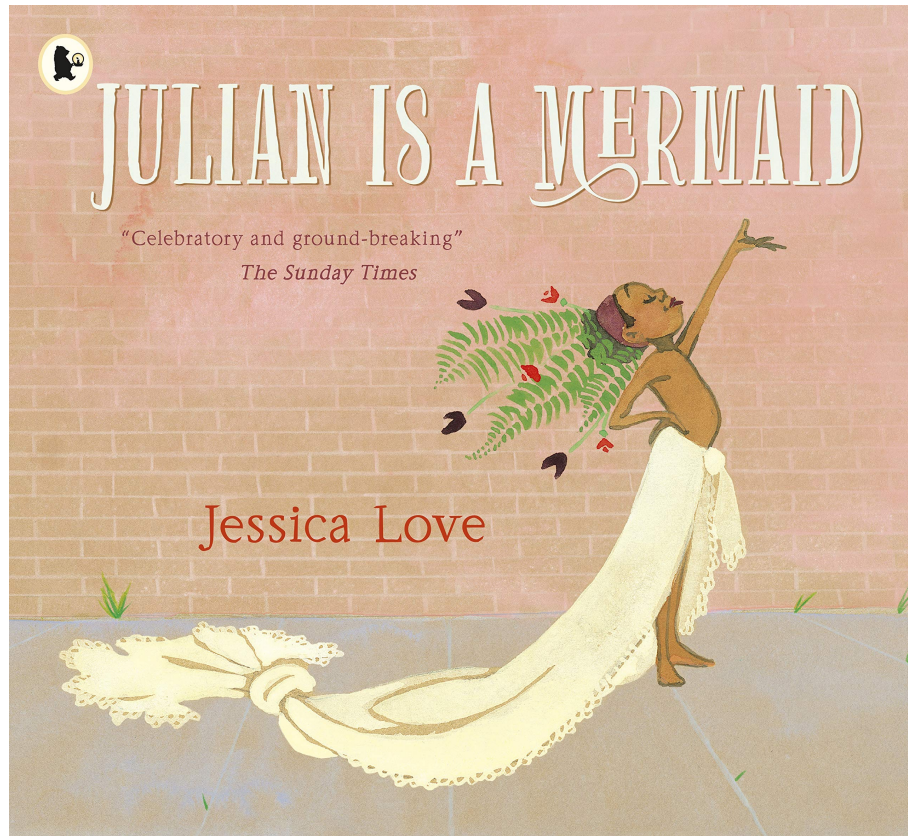

5. Julian is a Mermaid

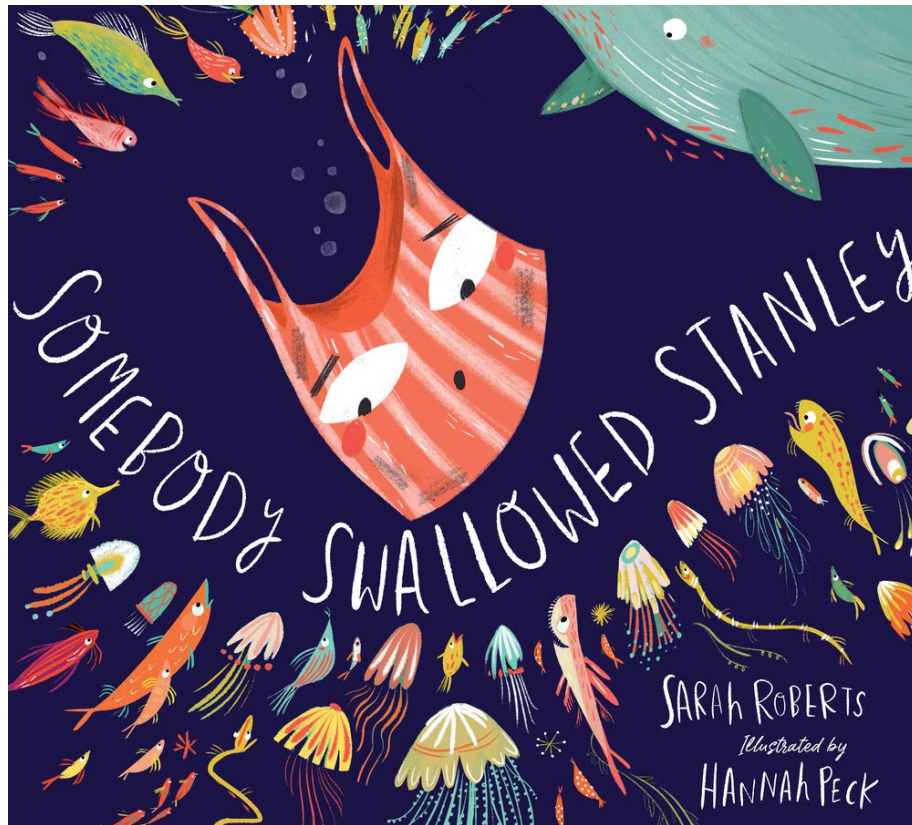

6. Somebody Swallowed Stanley

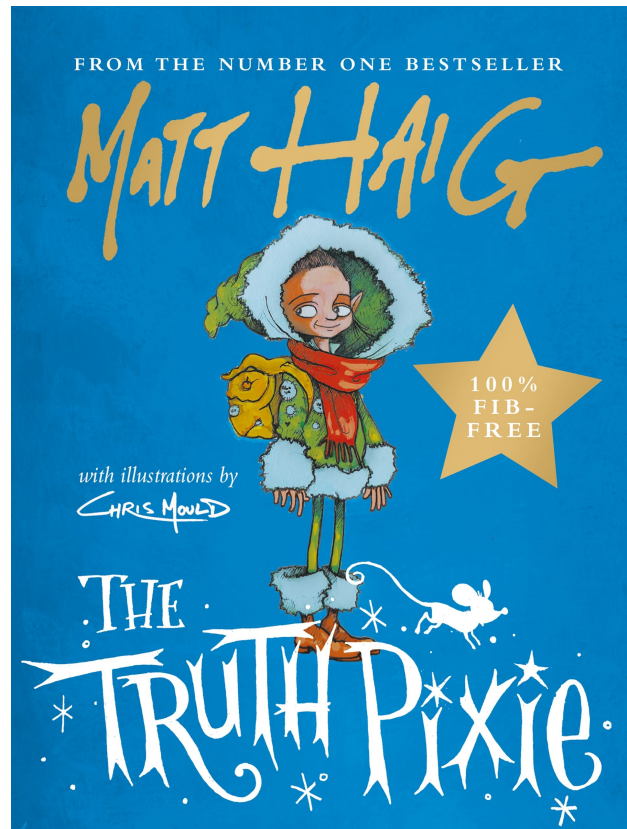

7. The Truth Pixie

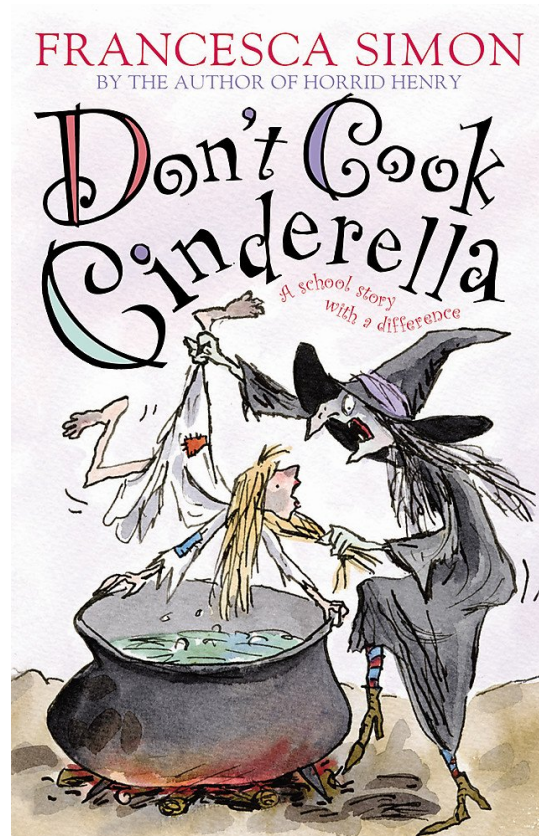

9. The Magic Paintbrush

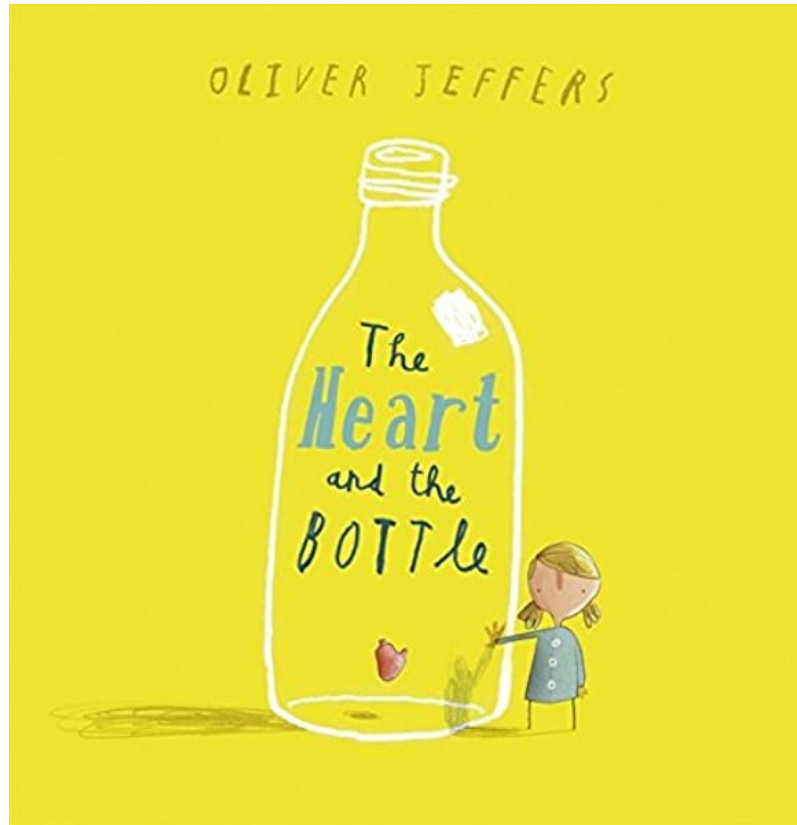

10. The Heart and The Bottle

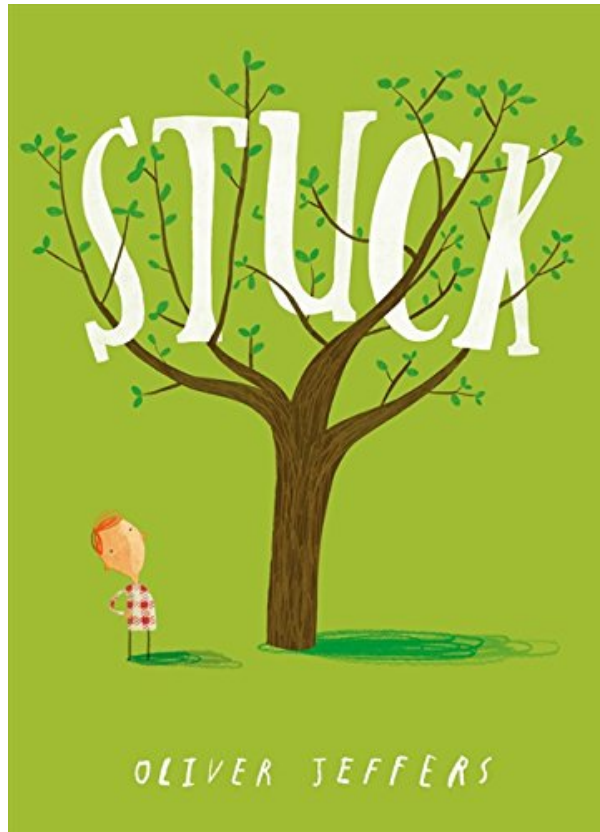

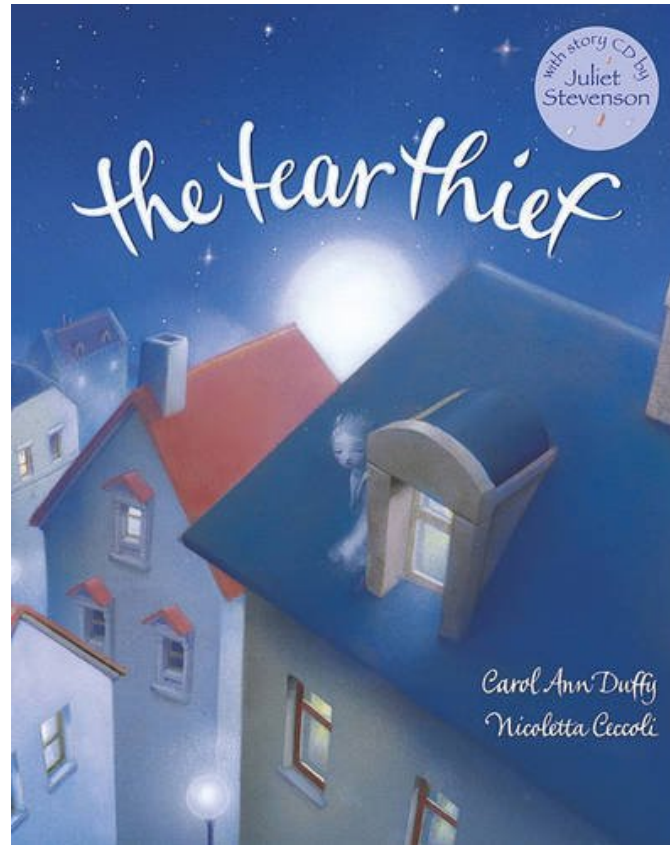

12. The Tear Thief

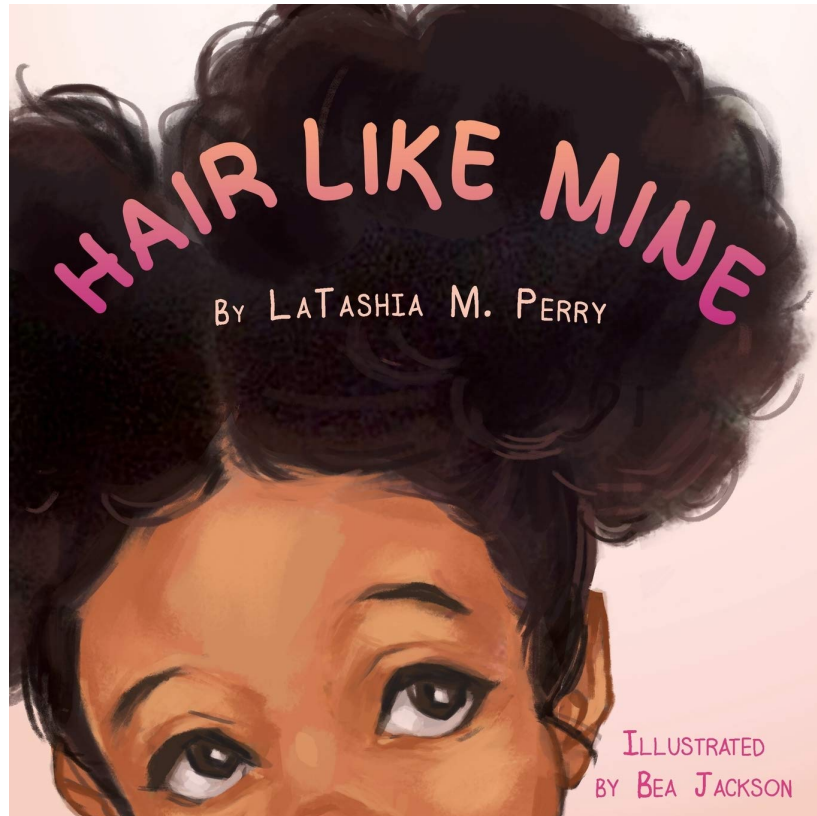

13. Hair Like Mine

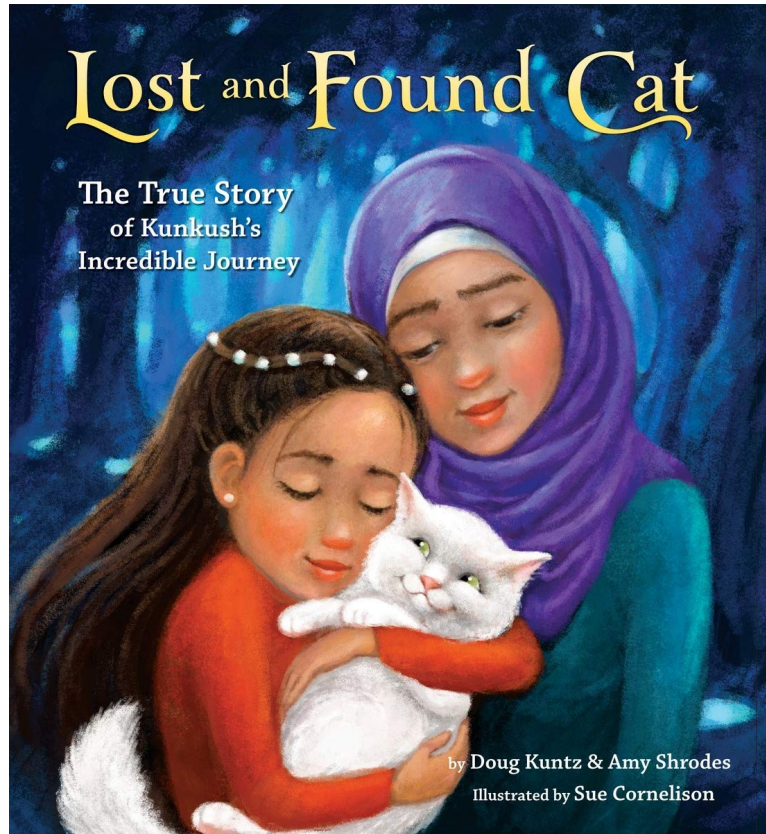

14. Lost and Found Cat

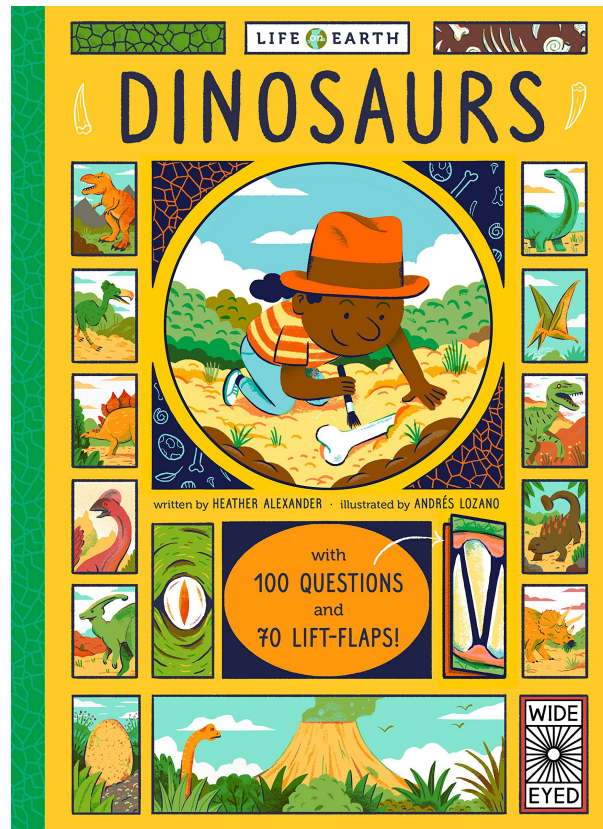

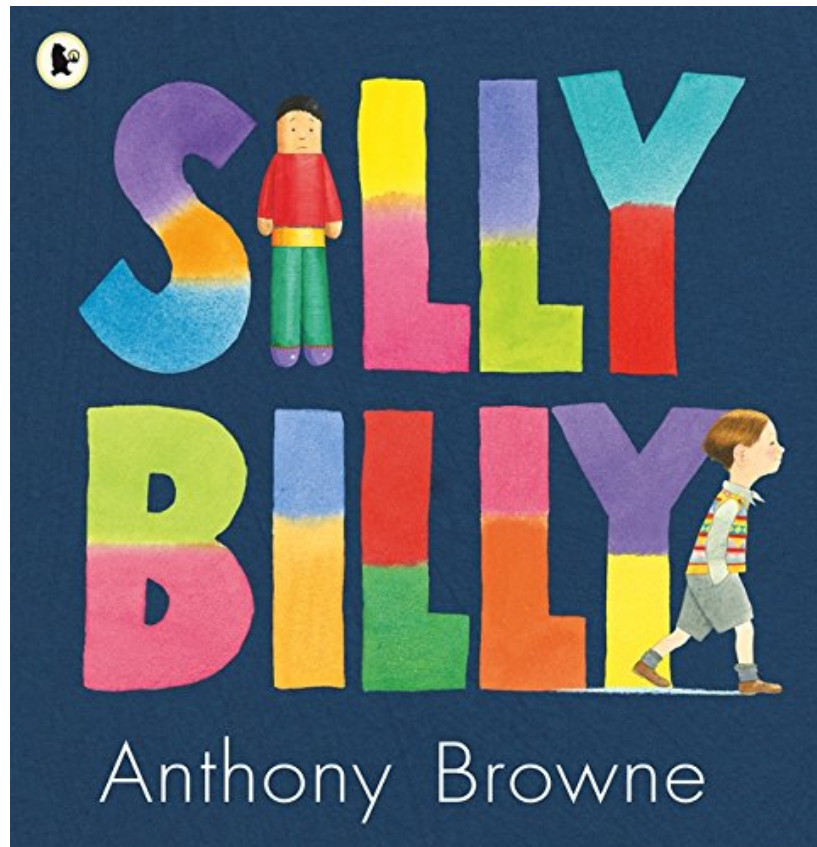

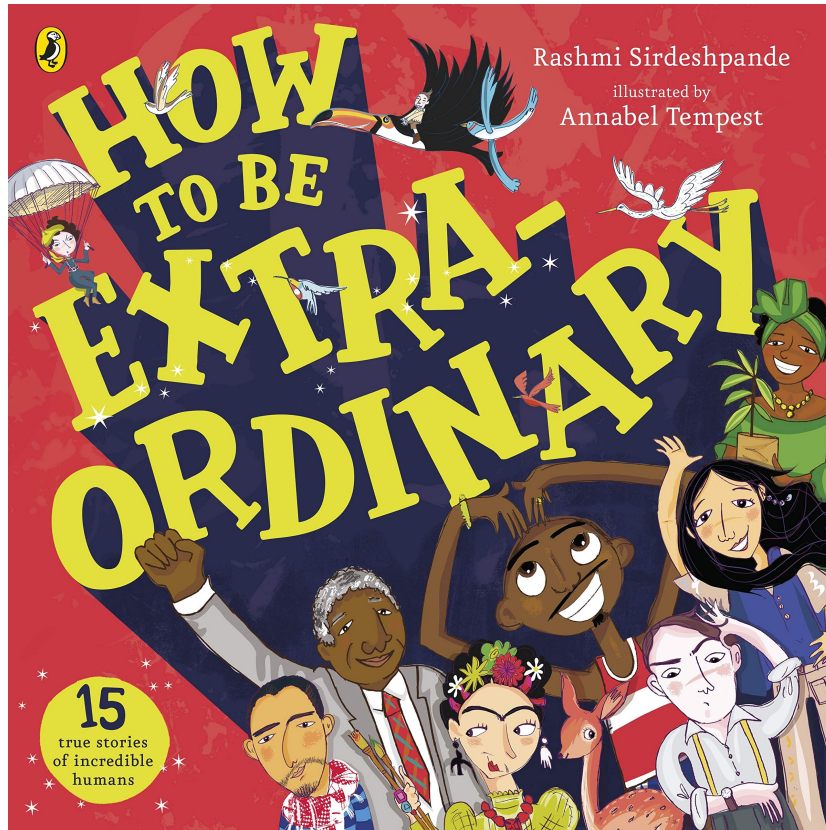

18. The Girl, the Bear and the Magic Shoes

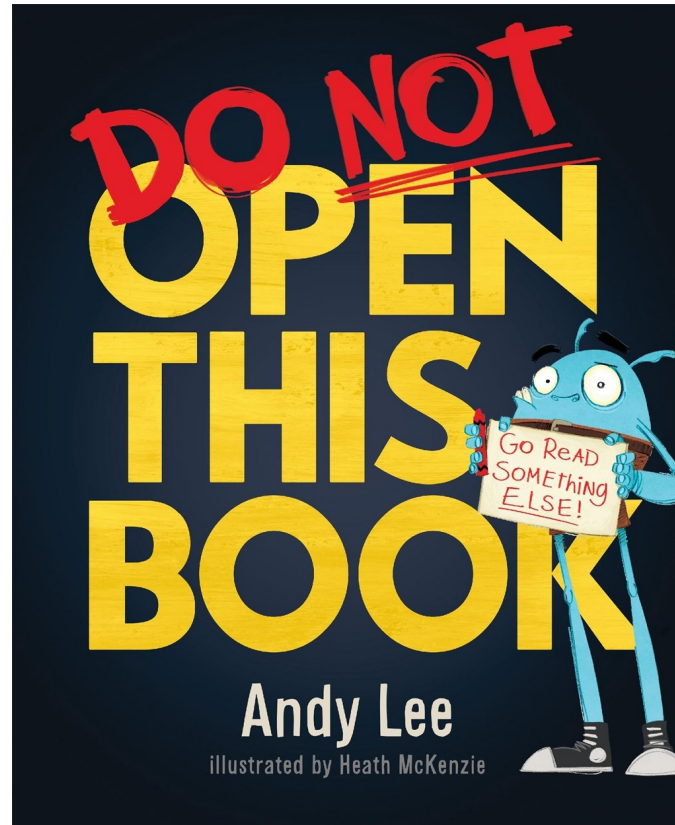

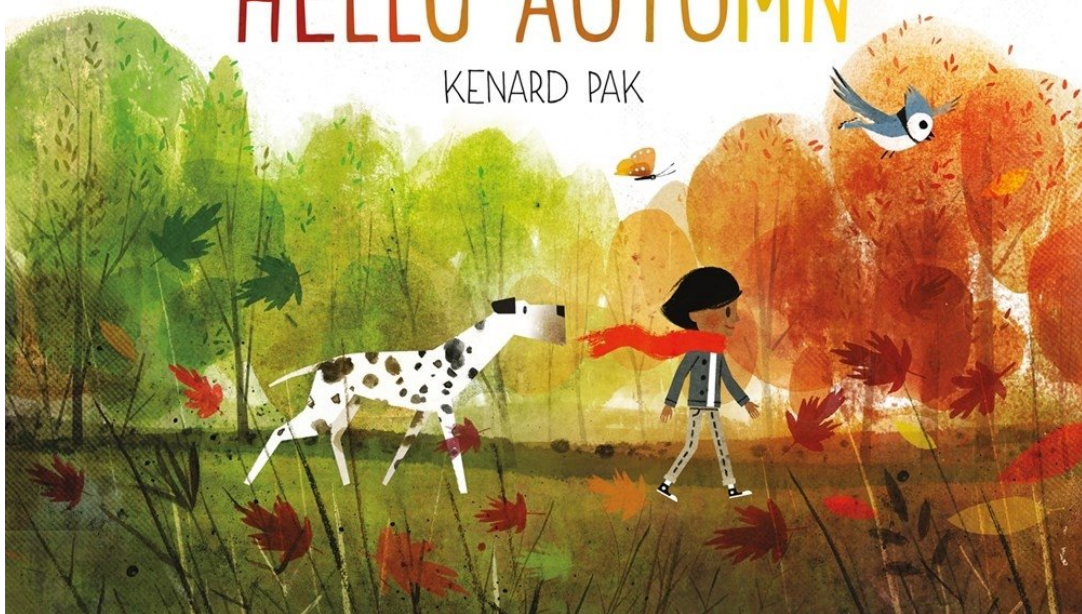

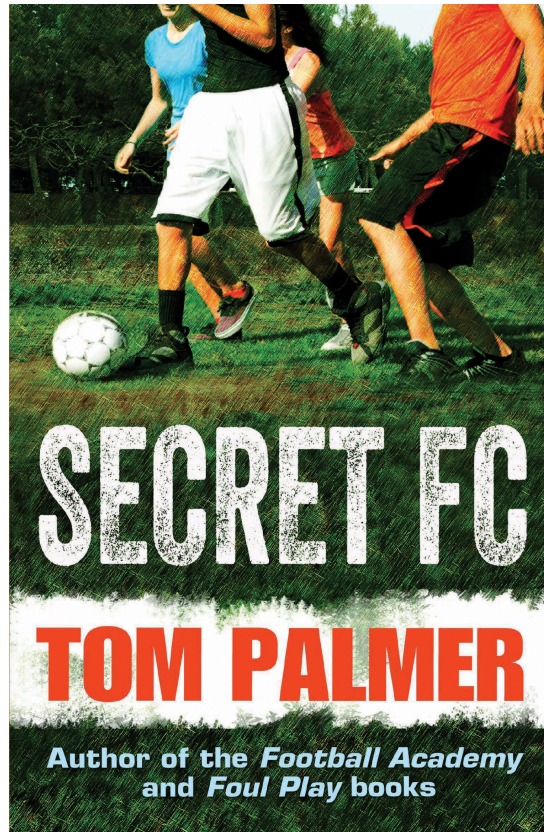

21. Secret FC

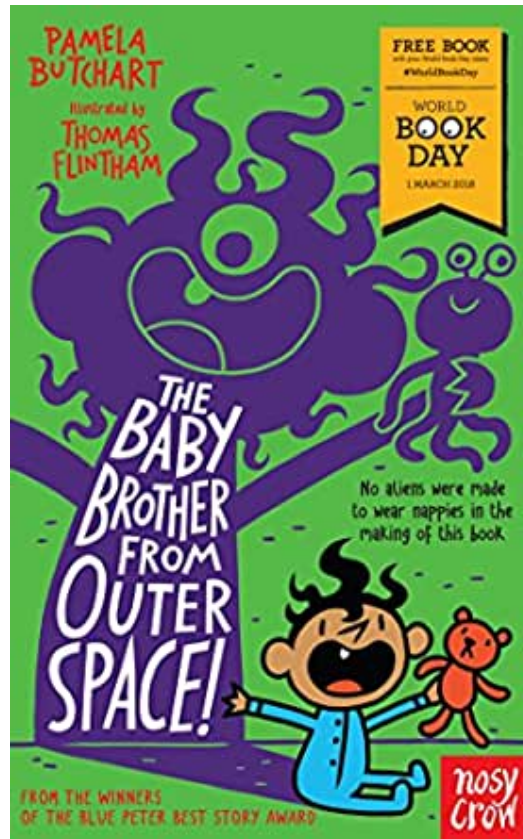

22. The Baby Brother from Outer Space

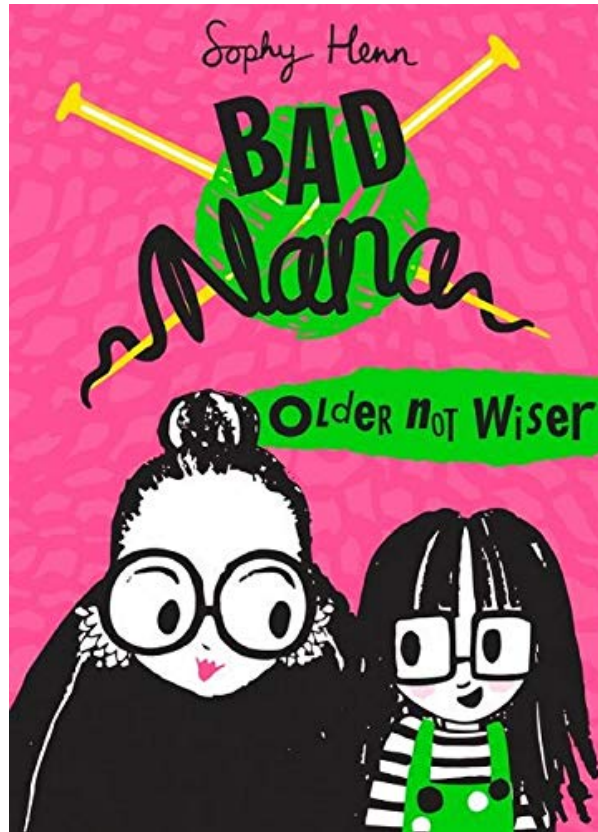

23. Bad Nana: Older Not Wiser

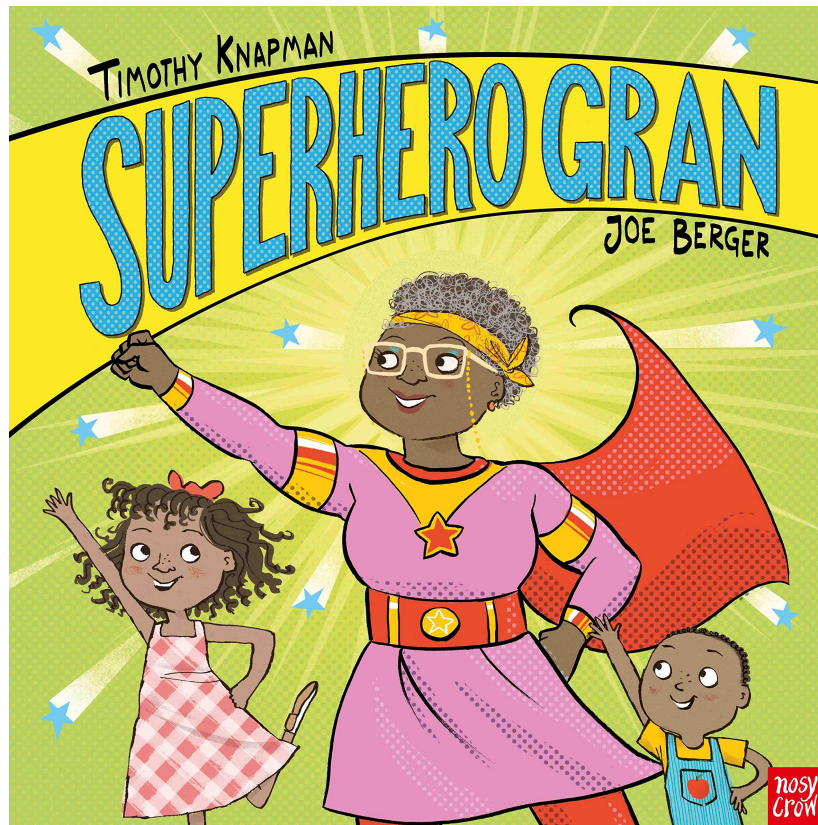
