I. Can You See Me?

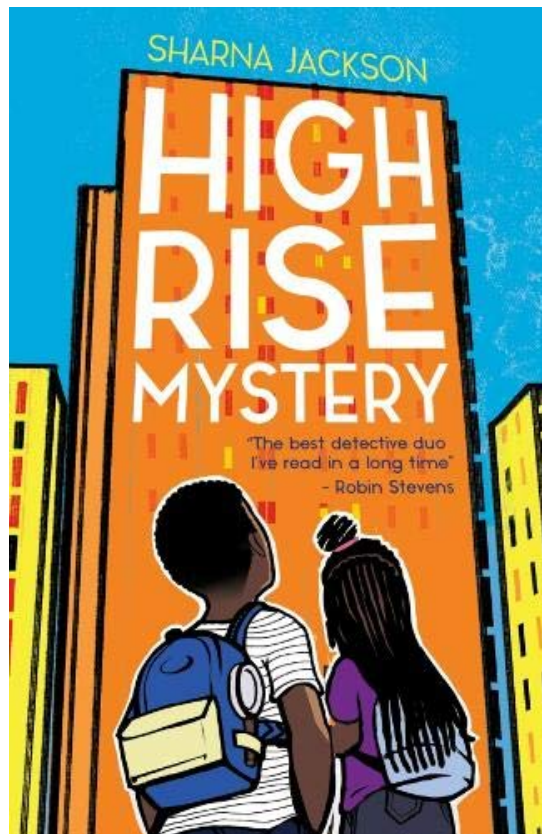

2. High Rise Mystery

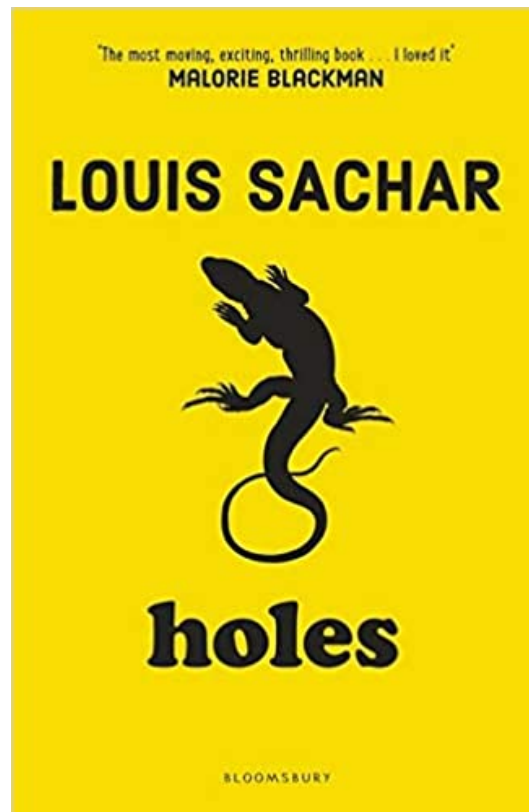

3. Holes

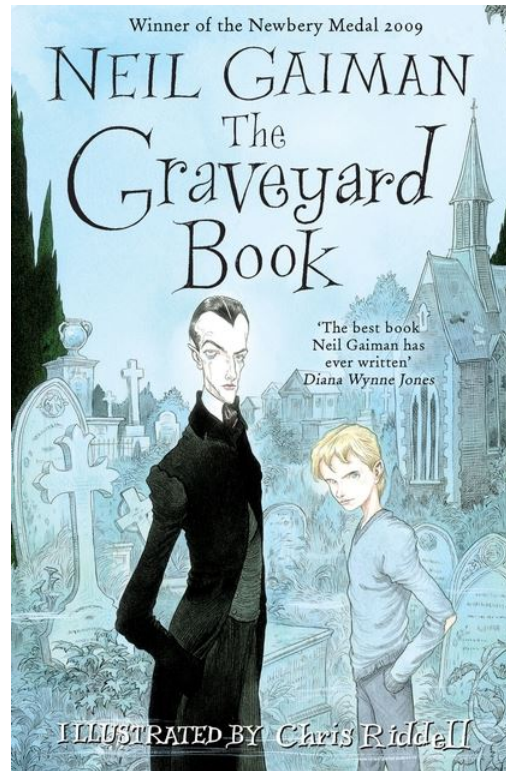

4. The Graveyard Book

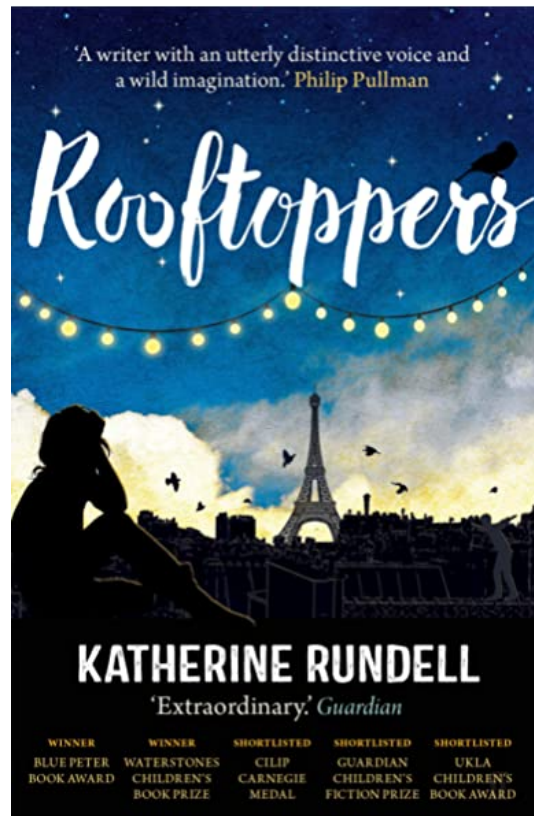

5. Rooftoppers

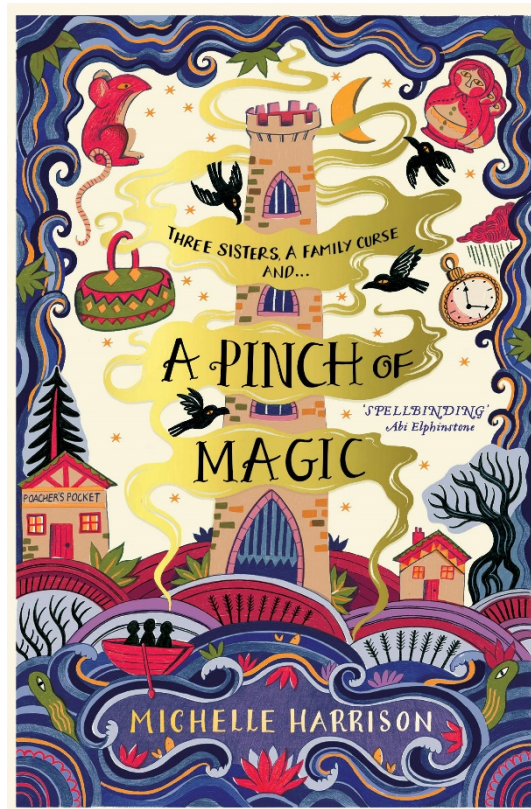

7. A Sprinkle Of Sorcery

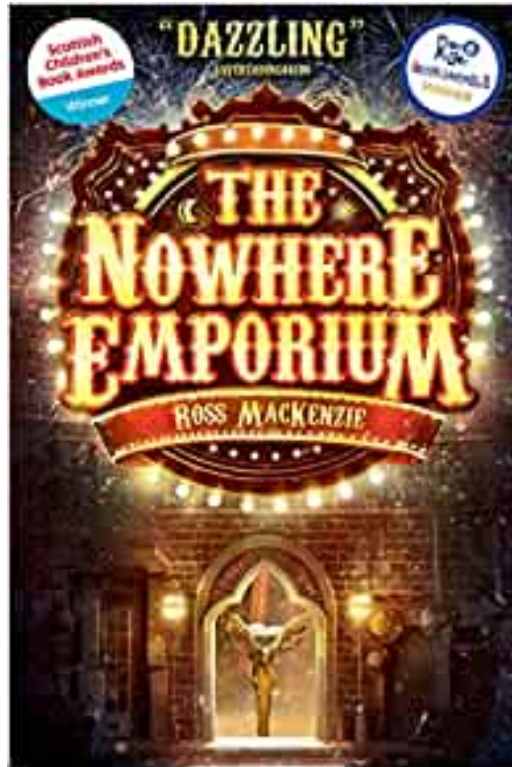

8. The Nowhere Emporium

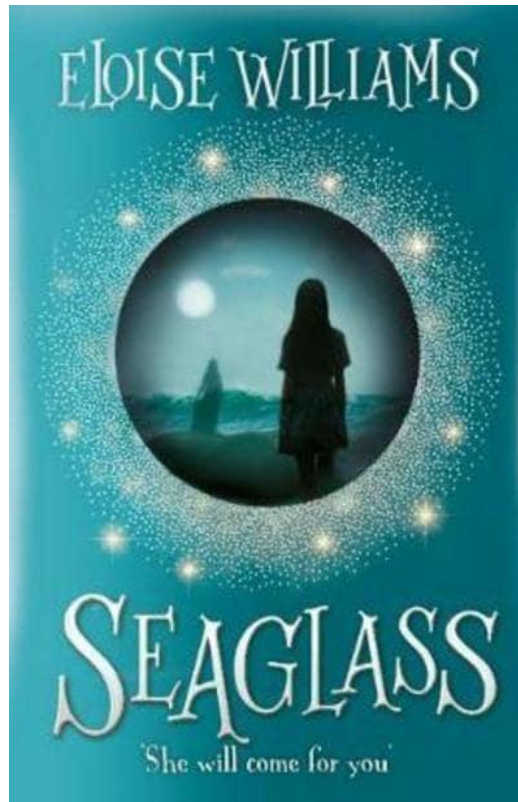

12. Who Let The Gods Out?

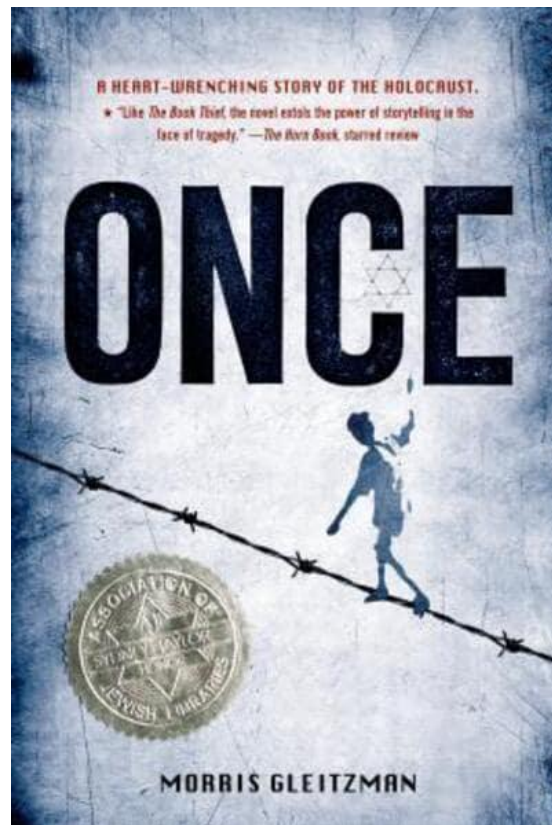

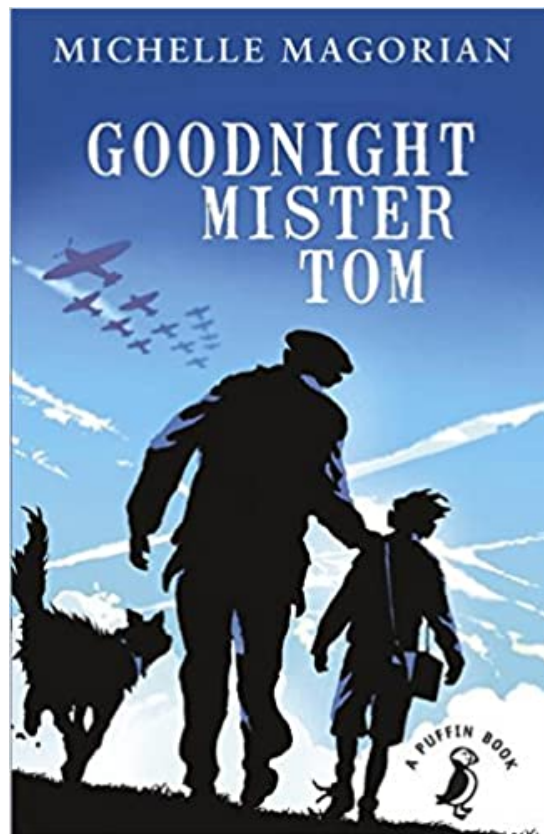

14. Goodnight Mr Tom

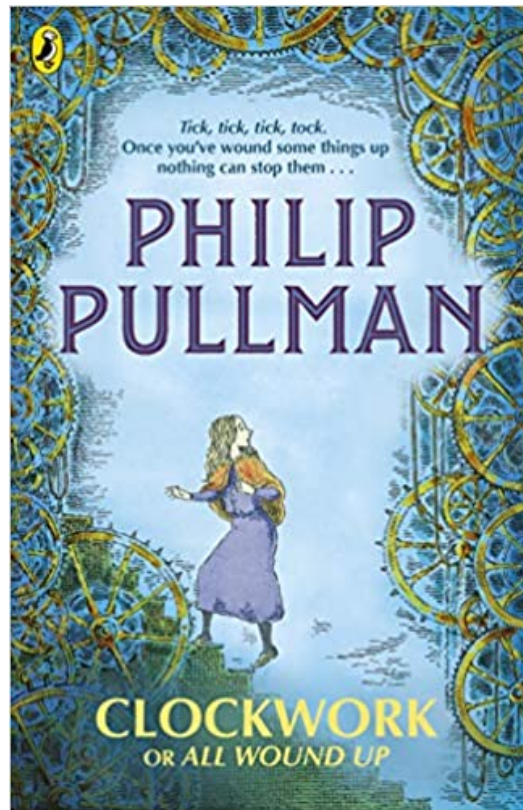

15. Clockwork

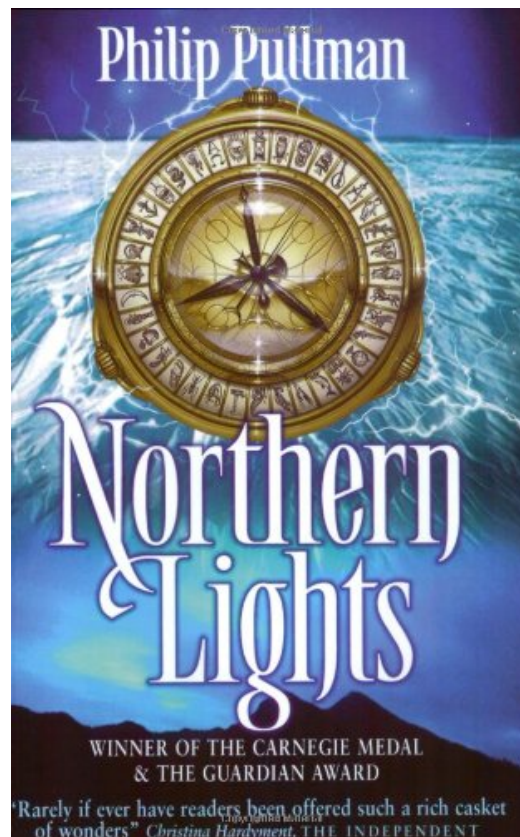

16. Northern Lights

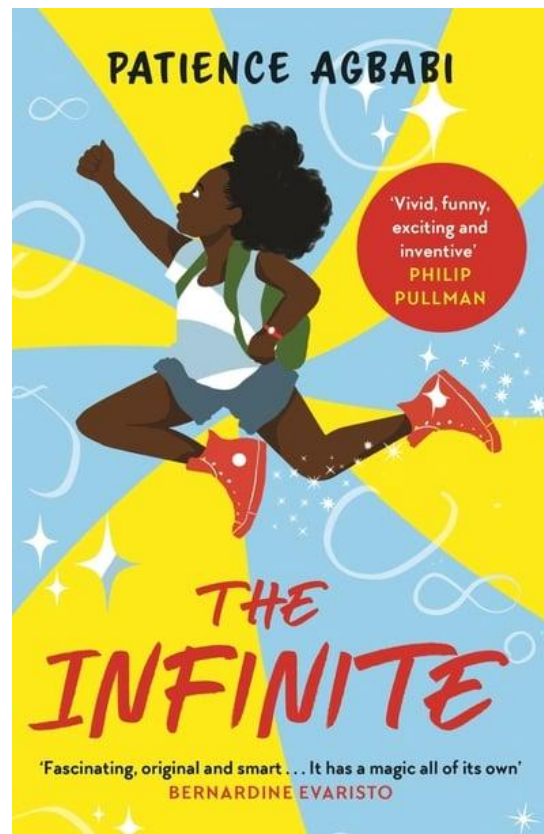

17. The Infinite

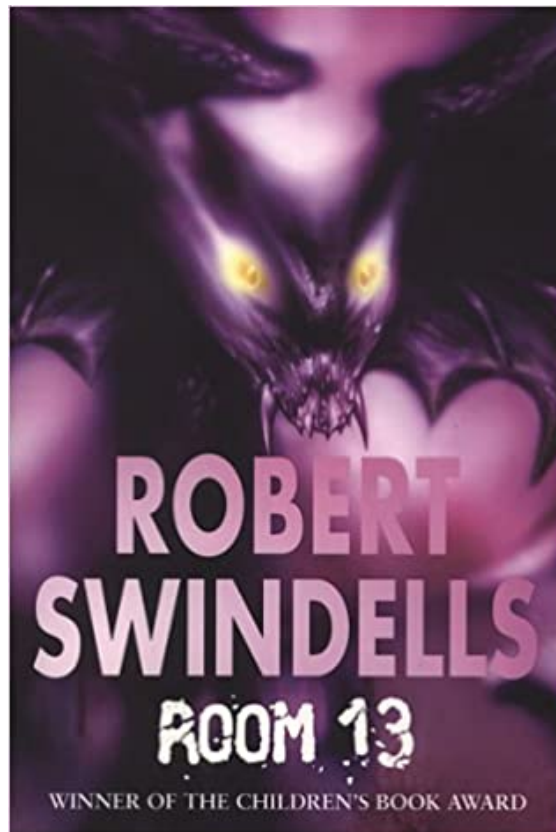

19. Swallows and Amazons

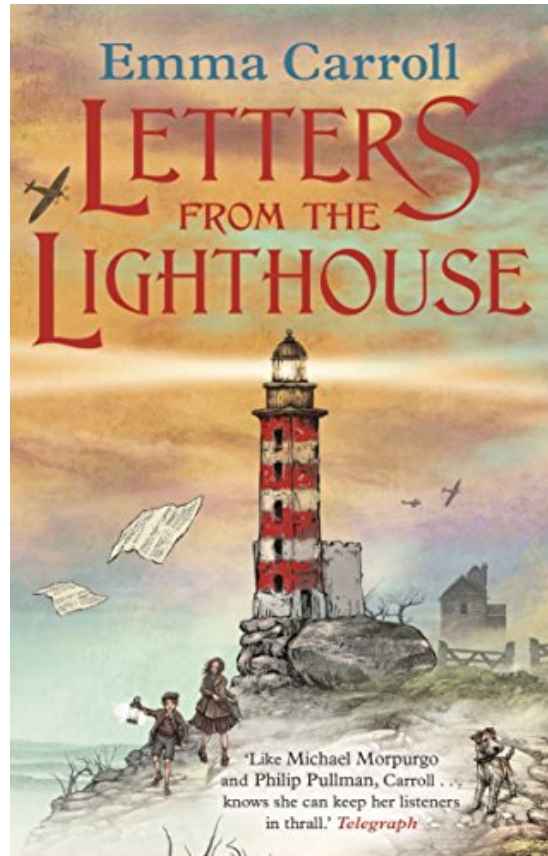

20. Letters From The Lighthouse

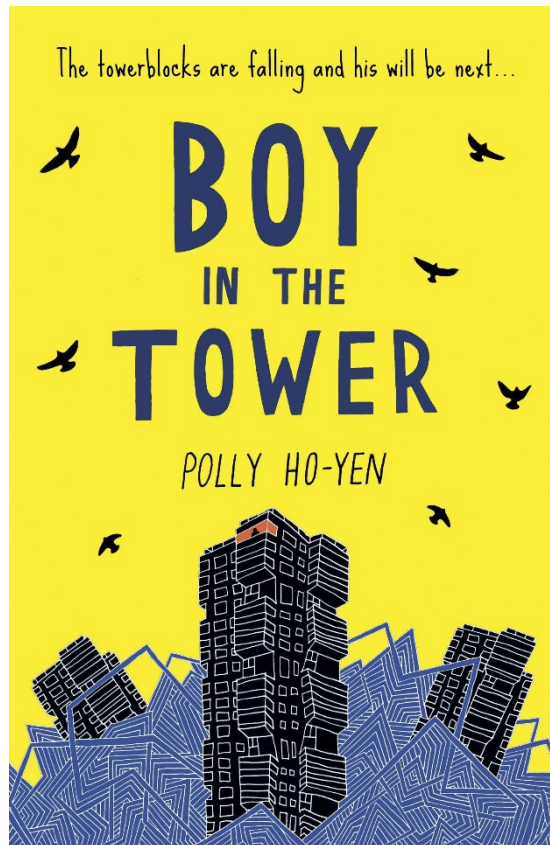

21. Boy In The Tower

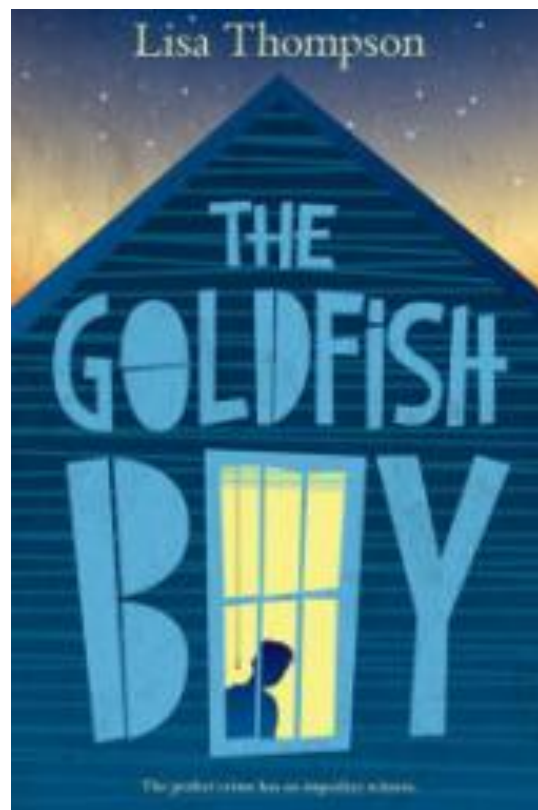

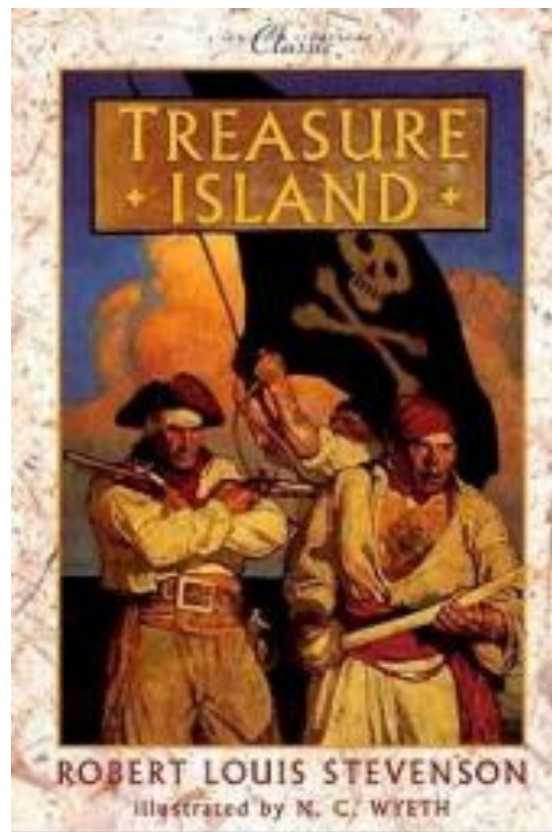

23. Treasure Island

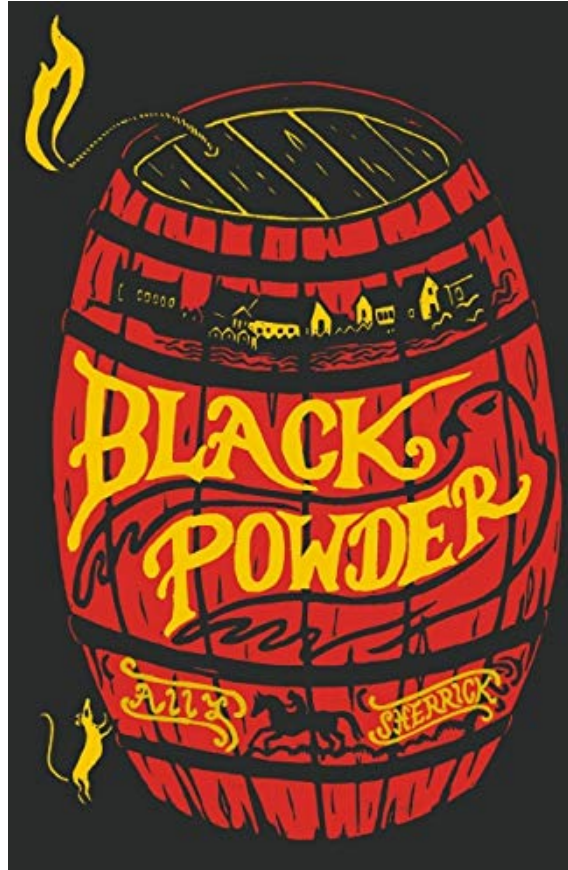

24. Black Powder

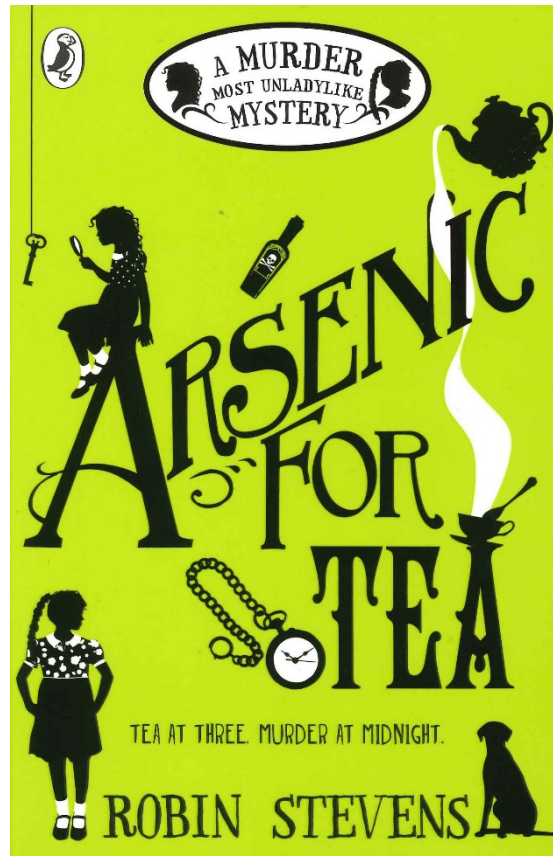

25. Arsenic For Tea

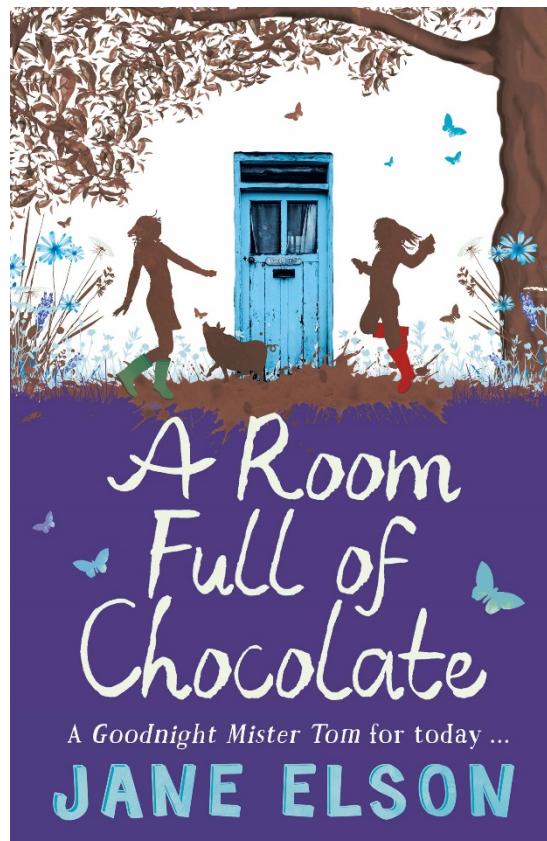

26. A Room Full Of Chocolate

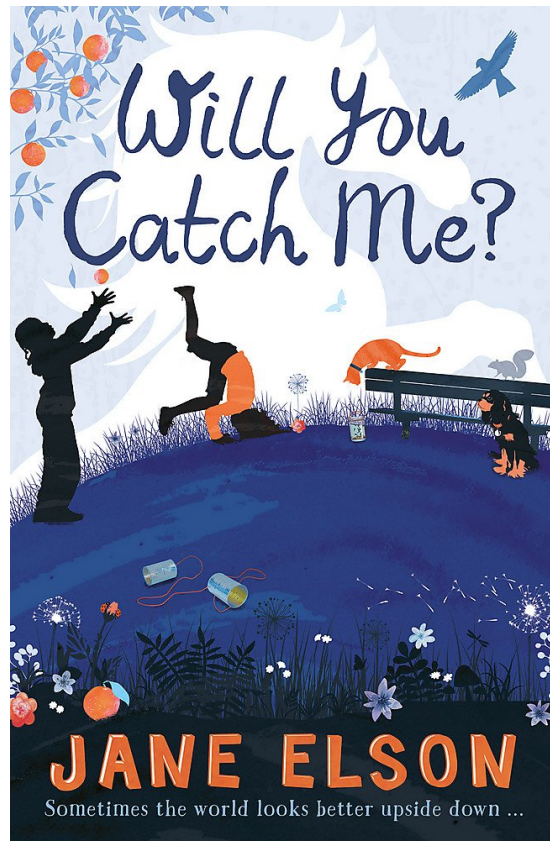

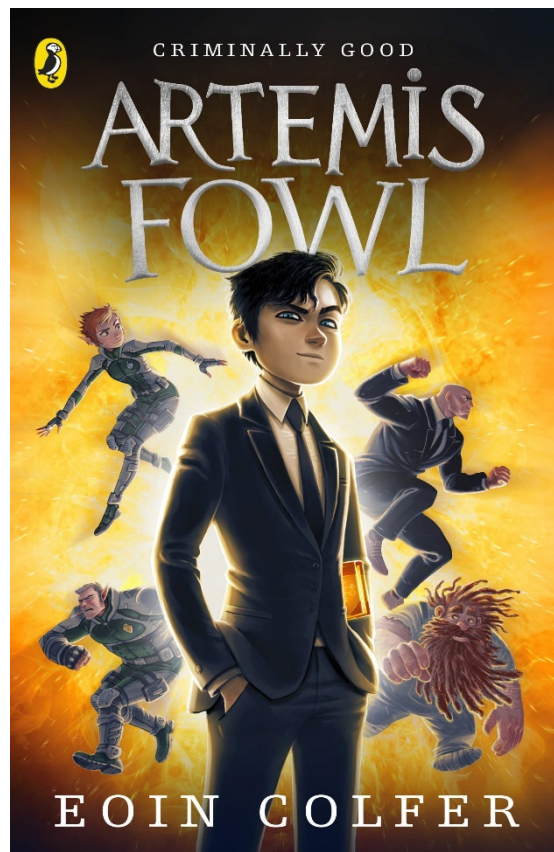

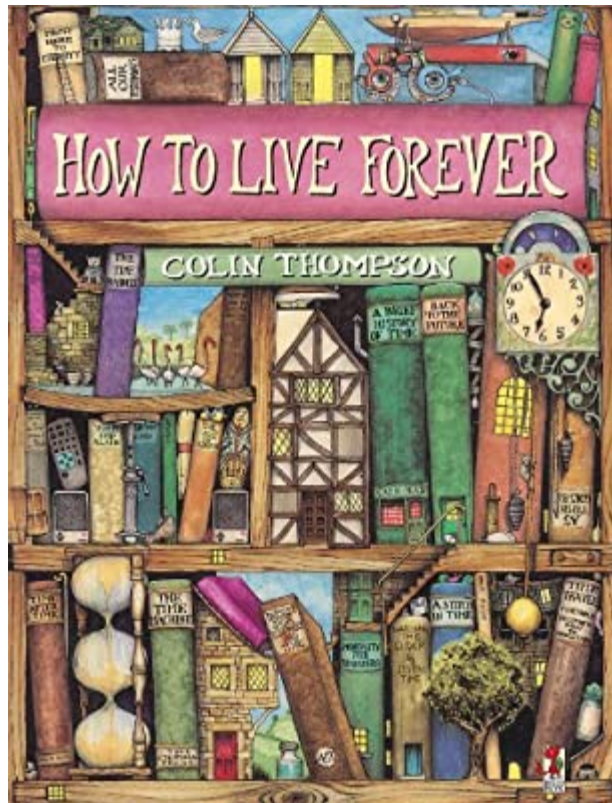

31. How To Live Forever

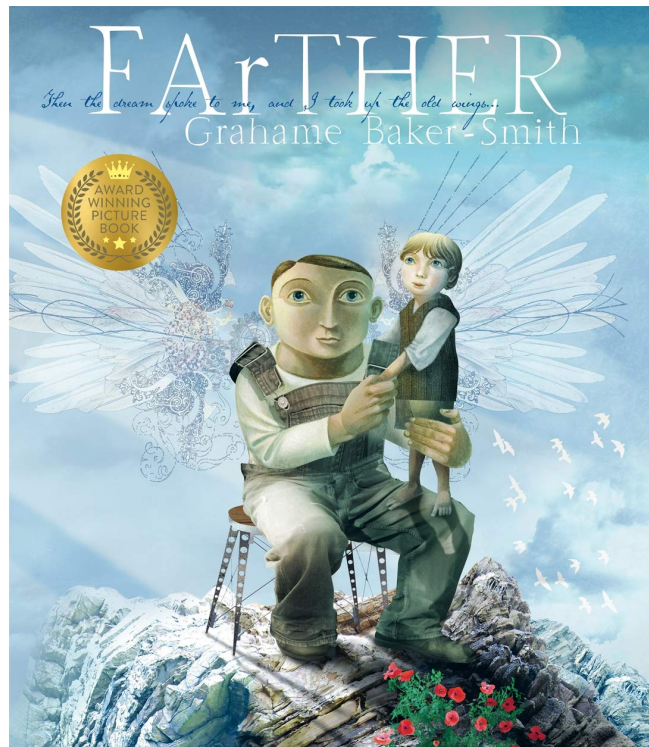
