The Khandais the symbol of the Sikh faith. It consists of three different types of weapons:

- A double edged sword or khanda in the centre
- A round throwing weapon known as a chakkar
- Two single-edged swords called kirpans, crossed either side of the other weapons

When Sikhs undergo the Amrit ceremony today and join the Khalsa (community of Sikhs), they must promise to keep all the rules of the Sikh faith, and also to wear the Five Ks.
