

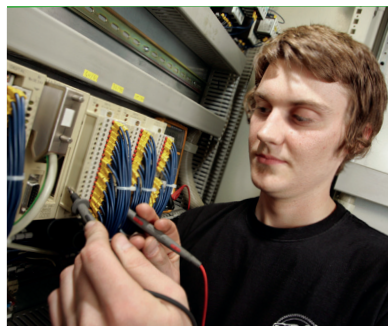

WHAT WE OFFER



FULL-TIME STUDY PROGRAMMES

Full-time students follow a personalised study programme designed to develop the all-round skills and qualities needed for university and employment. Personal development, employability skills, digital skills, a planned industry placement, regular progress meetings, career planning, and English and maths at the appropriate level are all included in their programme.

T LEVELS

T Levels are a new technical qualification aimed at delivering career-specific skills and experience for progressing to university, highly skilled employment or a higher/degree apprenticeship. From 2021, B&FC will be offering eight T Level routes – read more about these later in this guide.

LEVEL 3 TRIPLE DIPLOMAS

Our Level 3 Triple Diplomas are the equivalent to studying three A Levels. They carry the maximum 168 UCAS points but unlike A Levels they are more assignment based with significant emphasis on industry experience. Depending on your child's GCSE results, they might need to start off on a level 1 or 2 course.

COMBINED DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

Our Combined Diploma programme allows students to keep their options open by developing skills in two subjects (one as a Double Diploma 2 days a week and one as a Single Diploma 1 day a week – an additional day is spent in industry on a relevant placement).

APPRENTICESHIPS

An apprentice is employed while working towards a nationally-recognised qualification. They develop their skills mostly through on-the-job training, with around 20% of their time spent doing 'off-the-job' training, usually at college. Ideally, apprentices need to have a suitable position before they can start but we can support your child to find an appropriate role.

ANOTHER OUTSTANDING RESULT!

It's been an extraordinary year, but B&FC students performed outstandingly, achieving a 100% pass rate across no less than 13 subject areas.

Business student Ella Bradshaw celebrated double distinction stars and a Young Enterprise award for sustainability. She's now been offered a prized place on BAE Systems' Project Management Degree Apprenticeship.

T-LEVELS

THE NEW TECHNICAL AND PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS



WHAT ARE THEY?

T Levels are the new 2-year technical qualification, equivalent to doing 3 A Levels. They combine classroom learning and an extended industry placement (45 days minimum) to provide the knowledge and skills universities and employers look for.

The academic entry requirements are the same but because they have been designed with industry, they are career rather than subject based.

WHY CHOOSE A T LEVEL?

- ➔ Designed with more than 200 leading businesses and employers
- ➔ The chance to learn what a real career is like while studying
- ➔ Leads to a nationally recognised certificate showing learning outcomes
- ➔ Worth UCAS points (T Level Distinction* = 3 A Levels at A*)

WHAT SUBJECTS CAN YOU STUDY?*

The following T Levels will be available from 2021, with the government planning to introduce more T Levels in subsequent years.

BUILDING SERVICES ENGINEERING FOR CONSTRUCTION

Students develop core knowledge of how the construction industry works as well as an understanding of the principles of design and the role of technology and sustainability. They can then specialise in a building services area of their choice.

Careers: Plumber Heating and Ventilation Engineer / Facilities Manager - Building Services / Electrician / Engineering Site Manager

DESIGN, SURVEYING AND PLANNING (CONSTRUCTION)

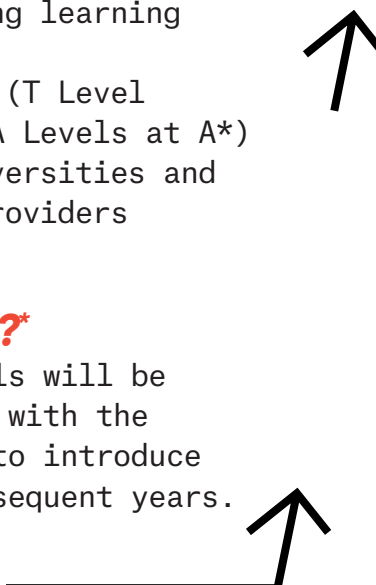
This T Level explores the design, construction and operation phases of the building lifecycle alongside the role of technology and sustainability. Students learn traditional techniques as well as modern ones such as computer aided design (CAD).

Careers: Architectural Designer / Building Surveyor / Civil Engineer / Estate Agent / Land Surveyor / Quantity Surveyor / Structural Engineer

DIGITAL PRODUCTION, DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT

This T Level develops an understanding of data and digital systems, how software and business interact, security, testing, planning and legal issues. Students also develop specialist skills in understanding user needs and designing and developing digital systems.

Careers: Software Developer / Game Developer / Software Tester / Application Developer / Web Developer

DIGITAL SUPPORT SERVICES

Students learn the essentials of all digital roles by understanding data and digital systems, how software and business interact, security, testing, planning and legal issues. They then specialise in digital infrastructure, digital support or network cabling.

ONSITE CONSTRUCTION

This T Level provides core knowledge of how the construction industry works, the principles of design and the role of technology and sustainability. Students can specialise in bricklaying, carpentry and joinery, painting and decorating or plastering.

Careers: Bricklayer / Site/Bench Carpenter / Painter and Decorator / Plasterer / Construction Site Manager / Quantity Surveyor

EDUCATION

In Year 1, everyone studies child development and how education works plus important topics like safeguarding and special educational needs. During Year 2, students specialise in either early years education or assisting teaching.

Careers: Support Worker / Early Learning & Childcare Practitioner / Teacher / Nursery Manager / Teaching Assistant / Education Welfare Officer

SCIENCE

This T Level provides the essential knowledge and skills to work in science or healthcare, allowing students to specialise in at least one of the following: animal sciences; food sciences; laboratory services; metrology (measurement) sciences.

Careers: Pathology Scientist / Pharmacy Technician / Forensic Scientist / Physicians Associate / Veterinary Nurse / Zoologist

HEALTH: ADULT NURSING

Students develop the technical skills and knowledge relating to how the health industry works, human anatomy and disorders of the body, health and wellbeing, and person-centred care in a clinical role. They can specialise in adult nursing.

Careers: Adult Nurse, Healthcare Assistant and other allied health roles.
