Dear Parents and Carers,

As we move towards the end of the school year, we are spending most of our time considering the best possible start to the new one. The key start dates for next year have been amended slightly bringing year 7 in a day earlier than previously advertised, but they are:

- Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> September: School is open to new Year 7 students only
- Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September: School is open to new Year 7 and Year 11 students only
- Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September: School is open to all students

Whilst the country returns to some form of normality, we have put together a guide of how we can best translate the government guidance for reopening. This is a draft document at this stage and the governors will be required to sign off a number of documents that will be produced over the summer. We also think there may be changes for schools communicated over the next few weeks, as the science and information moves forward (i.e. guidance on face coverings). However, this guide does give a flavour of what school will be like for the first term.

Please take time to read it, or if you prefer, I have created a presentation repeating the main points. It does cover everything we think you need to know to start the new year successfully.

Many of the questions we get tend to be linked directly to the government advice around social distancing. However, the guidance is clear that schools will reopen and that we must focus our attention on "controls" and accept that social distancing will not be possible.
