

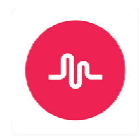

Safer Internet Day is co-ordinated in the UK by the UK Safer Internet Centre and sees thousands of organisations get involved to promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for children and young people.

The best way to react is to report and/or block the person bullying them, talk to someone they trust like a parent, carer, teacher or Childline and it's a good idea to keep a record of the bullying, like a screen shot.
