



Studying design and technology provides creative opportunities to participate in new activities, including technical knowledge and practical skills.





There are two areas within technology:

ENGINEERING – We will learn how to design and make products using a range of skills, including creating electronic circuits, using machinery and tools, for example making items with the vacuum former and making our own items for a specific person or outcome.

We will also teach you how your knowledge can be applied in industry. You will learn how to use a range of Computer Aided Design skills and Computer Aided Manufacture.

FOOD – We will learn how to make nutritious and healthy choices when choosing food and you will develop a wide range of practical skills that will help you become independent and confident in the kitchen for today and later in life. You will be taught the principles of hygiene and safety and you will be able to apply these principles when you make your dishes.

Our curriculum exposes students to 'real world' issues in which students are enriched and inspired culturally and emotionally and are encouraged to challenge ideas and perceptions.

In year 7 you will study:

- The novel 'Trash' by Andy Mulligan
- Explore diverse voices in poetry and narratives
- Discover some of Shakespeare's villains
- Complete a pleasurable 'read for three'
- And finally explore George Orwell and the key themes in 'Animal Farm' in preparation for studying the novella in year 8.

Our students enjoy reading and everyone in year 7 and 8 takes part in the

Accelerated Reader scheme. Reading is our passion and as such, we read at the beginning of every English lesson for 10 minutes. In years 9 -11 we continue our love for reading with initiatives and reading challenges; additionally, in year 9, we actively participate in the Lancashire Book Award of the Year.

Geography

Welcome to the Geography Department!

We take inspiration from the Geographical Association and believe that there are few things more fundamental than learning about 'the Earth as our home' as: "Geography is the study of the Earth as a home to humankind" (Johnson, 1985).

We encourage learners to be inspired, motivated, and challenged, resulting in them gaining a deep and rich understanding of the world in which they live.

Geography is a multi-faceted discipline that combines the analysis of social questions, environmental issues, and modern real-world solutions and as such is an important part of other academic subjects.

Learning about Geography applications in the real world is important. We use different sources including the news, @LSAGeography maps, data, images, and documentaries. We also experience Geography through different fieldtrips in the school grounds and further

afield. Next year these include: Ingleton Waterfalls and Whitescar Caves to see how water has shaped the landscape; Ecosystems at the zoo and Blackpool Tower. In KS4 students do a coastal investigation in

Cleveleys and an Urban Regeneration study in Blackpool. In addition, we do investigations in the local area. Students get to experience the Geography they learn in the classroom and apply their knowledge and understanding to the real world in which they live.



Easter 2022 KS3 & KS4 students visited Iceland. Here we experienced the land of fire and ice, and gave students a fantastic opportunity to see geographical processes in action. We walked around a volcanic crater, on a glacier, experience d waterfalls, geysers, and swam in the Blue Lagoon. We hope to return in 2024.

History

At Key Stage 3, we aim to inspire a sense of curiosity, interest and debate about history. In Year 7, we offer a fascinating look at Britain from the Anglo-Saxons to the Elizabethans. We will engage

We are one of the most popular GCSE option

subjects with around three hundred students studying history at KS4. Our GCSE covers a wide range of topics, from the Crusades to the Cold War.

During their time at LSA, we hope to give students the opportunity to visit key historic places. These include visits to Quarry Bank Mill, Auschwitz and the First World War Battlefields.

A warm welcome to Religious Studies!

In RS we aim to provide a stimulating, varied and enriching learning environment to prepare students for life in a culturally diverse, modern global world.

RS provides students with the opportunity to debate and discuss; to question and to articulate their views

verbally as well as developing their extended writing skills.

Students will be encouraged to develop thorough research

skills; weigh up evidence; develop logical chains of reasoning and evaluate...all within the use of specific religious terminology.

In year 7 students will extend and deepen their knowledge and key beliefs of 4 main religions and worldviews by looking at core elements of faith; religious views



on how we got here through creation stories and religious practices that enhance a sense of belonging and community. Religions studied include Christianity, Hinduism, Islam and Buddhism.

This year our students have had the opportunity to learn Spanish, Italian and even some Japanese as part of our More than Grades programme. At Christmas, students also had the opportunity to enjoy a variety of German Christmas treats and our German intern shared with them how Christmas is celebrated in Germany.

In July, 38 students will be visiting Northern France, staying in a château and experiencing French life; visiting a boulangerie, making crêpes and even trying snails! We are really looking forward to being able to use our French skills in a real life situation.

We have a partner school in Werne in Northwest Germany. We are hoping that next year we will be able to restart our German exchange with students from LSA hosting their German partners in their own home and then spending a week in Germany at their partner's home.

As part of the PASCH initiative, we also have 7 students in Years 9 and 10 who will embark on a three weeks, all expenses paid, study course in Germany over the summer holidays. They are excited about the students they are going to meet from other countries and the amazing things they are going to be able to experience.

Music

Science

Science is a fantastic subject that looks into living and non-living systems; from the smallest atom to the farthest reaches of the Universe!

In Year 7 we cover all of the Science subjects: Biology (topics including: organisms, ecosystems and genes), Chemistry (topics including: matter, reactions and Earth) and Physics (topics including: forces, electromagnets, energy and waves).



Our Science club is very popular, giving students the chance to undertake many experiments: pupils have completed a wide variety of investigations from analysing the effectiveness of soap samples on bacterial growth to looking at forensic science experiments and slime club!

Previously we have run trips to the zoo, studied ecology at Leighton Moss and this year some of our students attended the

Science Live talks where they had the chance to see five of Britain's top scientists discussing their work at the cutting edge of science.

Many of our Key Stage 3 students decide to choose Combined Science at Key Stage 4. Last year our GCSE results in single sciences and combined sciences have been above national averages. We also had 26 pupils that achieved a grade 9 in at least one science subject.

C4 + C5: This year at open evening you have the opportunity to get "hands on" with some great experiments to try. You can also talk science with some of our fantastic students.

PE


Welcome to the PE Department!

As you will notice from visiting our facilities and observing students, PE is a subject that is relished.

Students study a range of activities at Key Stage 3 and 4 including Trampolining, Games, Athletics, Fitness and Orienteering. We make good use of technology including iPads, Apple TV, Heart rate monitors and a range of apps to enhance teaching and learning.

We offer a vast and varied extra-curricular programme, including both competitive and non-competitive sports, such as Table Tennis, Hockey,

Rugby, Trampolining, Football, Fitness, Netball, Basketball plus many more. We regularly compete (and finish first!) in the Fylde and Wyre leagues in Netball, Rounders, Football, Hocky, Rugby and Athletics. The extra curricular timetable can be found on the school website.
