There will be more than one Form Group in each bubble or group. Our **prefects** will be on site throughout the week, supporting and encouraging. They will be Y7 Mentors in September and will be allocated to the same Form groups that they will visit throughout year 7.

#### The Schedule

Monday - Love of Learning – Meet award winning children's authors Chris Bradford (Author of Bodyguard and Young Samurai), Matt Oldfield (The Ultimate Football Heroes Series), Sufiya Ahmed (author of Secrets of the Henna Girl) and Curtis Jobling (Author and Illustrator of Wereworld and designer of BAFTA winning Bob the Builder. Each group will start and end each day by reading one of their books. Every child will receive their own signed copy! Also pupils will meet Dan Worsley (Story teller and author of Impossible Tales and the Eric Appleby books.) Creative writing and story telling activities throughout the day.

**Tuesday – Sports** This is a truly inclusive day for everyone from elite sporty types to those pupils who are not sporty at all! We will have taster sessions in Rugby with a coach from Fylde Rugby Club, Sessions of table tennis, badminton, tennis, yoga, meditation and even Footgolf (lots of fun and no skill required ©) among other experiences. Pupils will also have a chance to practice being a pundit or sports journalist and see their work live online if they're happy with it.

### Wednesday - Aspiration & Careers and Leadership & Citizenship

Pupils are encouraged to develop leadership and great teamwork skills through a series of activities throughout the day delivered by the wonderful **Tree of Knowledge** Team. https://treeof.com/

We will explore aspirations and dreams for the future and start our new pupils on the path to making them a reality. Pupils will get to meet some of our amazing Alumni and will explore how best to prepare for their new life in Secondary school.
