Where will your child eat?

They can buy food and eat in the dining room, hall or in the outdoor areas.

How do I pay for food?

We no longer accept cash or cheque, instead we have a cashless catering system at LSA. Parents and carers can put money on their child's lunch account online using ParentPay. Students will be given their own unique pin number, which they use at the till to pay for any food they buy in school. Pupils can also use this pin number to check on their remaining balance. All students have a ParentPay lunch account even if they never use it.



Will I get my lunch at the same time as everyone else?

Year 7 will be the only year group having lunch at this time.

What else can students do at lunchtime?

Throughout the year a variety of clubs run in departments such as PE, your child can find out more about these in September. Students can also go to the library during lunchtime to read, do homework or use the computers.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

Open to all before school, at break, lunchtimes and after school every day. Everyone is welcome in the Library.

What do we use the Library & Learning Resource Centre (LRC) for?



- Librarians help, advise and support students.
- You will be quizzed on your books to gain points and grow your word count.
- Each year, about 100 students become millionaire readers.
- We hold author events where they come into school to meet students, give talks and provide great tips about writing fiction.

- As well as lending books, you can borrow e-books and audio books for use on devices at home.

- A full library lesson with time for quiet reading and to swap books every two weeks.

ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS

Here at LSA, we use a variety of electronic apps and systems to assist with supporting your child.



MyEd

MyEd is the school app parents use at LSA. This is really useful for sharing valuable information with parents and carers. The app is available for most android and apple devices.

The app is the messaging service used to send information about trips, lesson commitment, behaviour issues and attendance alerts.

MyEd also allows you to view information and keep up to date with what's going on in school. You can also view your child's attendance, timetable and behaviour incidents.



Satchel: One

Teachers will put any homework they give out on Satchel One.

You can download the app or access it online. This will show you the task and the due date for tasks your child has been set. You will receive a pin, which allows you to log in and view your child's homework.



ParentPay

ParentPay is the cashless catering system used in school to allow students to purchase food during the school day.

Parents will be given a username and password to create an account in order to 'top-up' a student's account. Using ParentPay is safer than students bringing money to school and is an instant way to ensure they have credit on their lunch account.



ClassCharts

ClassCharts allows parents to monitor and be notified of their child's achievements and negative behaviour within school. The maths department use two additional systems to help your child with Maths lessons and homework.



My Maths

MyMaths can be used to complete homework tasks, help consolidate learning and allows for more productive revision.



MathsWatch

MathsWatch is a set of mathematics resources, which include videos, worksheets and online homework for revision.





KEY Objectives

The PTFA has a few key objectives:

- To develop extended relationships between staff, parents and others associated with the school.

- To engage in activities which support the school and advance the education of its students.

- To assist in the provision of facilities, not normally provided by the Local Education Authority, for education at the school. A warm welcome to all mums, dads, carers, grandparents and friends of the school.

We welcome your support whether that is at our meetings or supporting one of the many events we hold to raise funds. Currently there are none running but we will keep you updated.

At each meeting the Head Teacher has a slot on the agenda which provides an excellent opportunity to talk about important/topical school issues. At the meetings we plan our future fund-raising events, discuss the distribution of funds raised and how the PTFA can support the school.

Alternatively, you can get involved by joining one of the following schemes:

- Rag Bag Collection Scheme
- Easy fundraising
- School Lottery

All the details for these schemes can be found on the PTFA section of our website.

A key role provided by the PTFA is the provision of refreshments for staff and visitors at Parent Consultation Evenings, Careers' Evenings and evenings where the students are staging events e.g. Music evenings etc.



UNIFORM

- A Black skirt* or black tailored trousers, black blazer and badge
- White shirt with standard collar (capable of being worn with a tie)
- School tie
- White/black socks or tights
- Sensible shoes** in black, brown or grey

- Plain black cardigan/pullover with V neck (wearing a pullover or cardigan is optional but wearing a blazer is compulsory)

*Black knee-length skirt (Banner 3596 Henley or Banner Thornton 913590A). 18" minimum length with school emblem. The skirt waistband must be visible. **Heels should not be more than 4cm

GENERAL APPEARANCE

- The skirt waistband must be visible.
- We continue to discourage hair styles that are seen as extreme. Definitions of extreme vary from person to person and from year to year. We continue to ask that parents work with the school if they are considering a new/different style.
- Jewellery, other than a wrist watch, should not be worn in school. Students with pierced ears may wear one small sleeper or one small plain stud in each ear. Finger rings can be dangerous and should not be worn.
- We do not allow students to wear facial studs or any other form of body-pierced jewellery as these can be a health and safety risk.
- Footwear with contrasting sports logos, writing or patterns is not acceptable. This means that black shoes may be worn, but be worn smartly (i.e. laces tied) If a black shoe is produced by a traditional sports manufacturer, this is allowed, as long as there are minimal logos/markings, and they are not a contrasting colour. Students are not allowed to wear pumps/plimsolls made of canvas even if they are black. Boots should not be worn.
- Hooded tops, fleeces, tracksuit tops, baseball caps and denim jackets should not be worn at school. Outdoor
 garments displaying obscene or offensive words or images are not appropriate for school. In cold weather, hats
 (but not baseball caps) can be worn when outside the building. In the summer term, tailored trousers of at least
 knee length may be worn. We will update students regularly with expectations around jumpers and blazers, due to
 ventilation in classrooms.
- Where additional items of uniform are worn for religious reasons, these should be in black (the school uniform colour).
- Make-up must be discreet. This applies equally to fake tan, foundation, eye liner and false eyelashes etc. This also applies to extended eye lashes, which are not allowed.
- Students must have short, tidy nails at all times.
- Students must not have any visible tattoos.

Please support our attempts to maintain high standards of appearance. The school reserves the right to send home any student who does not meet these expectations. It is important that the uniform is worn correctly and with pride. It is expected that the overall appearance is smart and in keeping with the fantastic reputation of the school in the local community.

MOBILE PHONE POLICY

As you will be aware, the use of mobile phones, smart watches and other smart devices has grown significantly in recent years. As a school, we are well aware of the power of these devices, both for good and harm.

Discussions with parents, teacher and students have shown a significant shift in views regarding the use of mobile phones within school. The growing complexity of social media and the links to mental health issues cannot be ignored. Therefore, we have taken the decision to amend our phone policy and ask that student's phones are not seen in school.

We are not taking the decision to "ban" phones, but we do require your support in setting the same high expectations we have always had. The simple message to all students is that if their phone is seen in school, at any time, then it will be confiscated and returned at the end of the school day. 
EMBEDDED LEARNING HOMEWORK EXPECTATIONS

Who do I speak to now that my child doesn't have just one class teacher?

Our reception will be open to pass on information and messages. Each child will have a Form Tutor as well as a Head Of Year. All of these people can be contacted via email and we would encourage as much interaction as possible.

What happens if something gets lost?

Please make sure all clothing and equipment is clearly marked with your child's name so that it can be returned if found.

Can I apply for free school meals?

If you think that your child is entitled to free school meals, please speak to a member of staff in the office who will help you with your application.

Can my child bring a mobile device to school?

The school recognises the benefits of mobile devices and will endeavour to allow students to bring their devices to school. However, the responsibility lies on students to follow the guidelines and parents to support them in order to get the best for each and every child in school. The school cannot take responsibility for any loss or damage. Phones must be switched off and kept out of sight in bags until the end of the school day.

What happens if my child has an accident at school?

Unfortunately, sometimes children do have accidents or become unwell whilst they are at school, in the event of this happening we would need to call you. Please ensure that we have up to date contact details for you.
