Dear Parents / Carers,

Children having leadership roles is a proven way to support self-confidence, communication skills and a sense of belonging. Year 6 pupils were asked if they would like to apply to be a prefect or to hold a position of responsibility at the start of the term and we were absolutely thrilled when so many applied for a post.

The written applications to be a prefect were so well written, with enormous levels of pride being shown in presentation and content. The answers to the questions asked clearly reflected the qualities and attributes that would be required in a position of responsibility. Children wrote how they needed to be responsible, to set the tone for others in their behaviour and of how kindness was important. They described how they would need to consider the feelings of others and support everyone to be successful. Reading their words made us extremely proud.

Some children opted to apply to be a House Captain, which is akin to a more traditional 'Head Pupil' position. This meant that Mrs Hancock and I interviewed them in small groups, asking them 4 questions to demonstrate their ability to describe and communicate how they would fulfil this role. Again, the children's responses were incredible. One was of particular note, when a pupil sought clarification of the question being asked in order to formulate a more focussed answer. Highly impressive!

We have celebrated all of our new prefects in assembly today and look forward to them spreading their positive influence across the school community.

We also have 30 children who have volunteered to support younger children during play time as 'Play Leaders'. They have now been trained and are promoting positive play every day. Thank you to all for choosing kindness and working together!

No Nut Policy

Maths Homework Books


