Dear Parents / Carers,

We regularly conduct attendance reviews as a school to analyse any trends in absence data as well as to initiate support for any families where their child(ren)'s attendance is below national expectations.

A key area that has come up from our reviews has been the number of absences from taking unauthorised holiday during term time. Aside from the legal requirement to ensure that children receive a full education through regular attendance at school, the impacts of removing children from schooling during term time are well documented and clear, for example:

- Pupils with **95–100% attendance** were **1.3 times more likely** to meet expected standards in reading, writing, and maths than those with 90–95% attendance at the end of primary school.
- Missing just 10 days in Year 6 reduced the likelihood of meeting expected standards by 25%.

Low school attendance also negatively affects social development. It limits engagement in group activities, reducing social interaction and emotional growth. It can be challenging for children to return to school following absence, both in terms of having missed key foundational knowledge taught during their absence and due to the emotional challenges of returning when other pupils have been present in school.

Despite this significant impact, the draw of taking holidays at a time when they are both cheaper and destinations are quieter is understandable. I have had discussions with partner schools, including Lytchett Minster, about altering term dates to enable an offset which would provide access to holidays off timetable from the standard holiday dates. Unfortunately, the practicalities of this are that with most staff's children not attending our schools, it is impossible to implement unless there is a whole council approach.

In looking at other options to support, we are now considering placing INSED days into 2 day groupings, one of which would be in September 2026, in order to enable access to cheaper travel before most schools have broken up. 






Trip payments
