

English: Reading into Writing

- ◇ *The Graveyard Book* by Neil Gaiman; The main task will be to write a story set in a graveyard
- ◇ We will also begin to look at variations of *the Three Little Pigs* - and we will write an instruction guide for pigs on how to wolf-proof their homes.
- ◇ In grammar, we will focus on using conjunctions and adverbials to link our paragraphs and how and when to use the passive voice.

Science

Human circulatory system

Identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and explain the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. We will also be able to recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function and describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

History & Geography
