

# LYTHAM C.E PRIMARY SCHOOL'S PROPOSED SPORTS FUNDING FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021

## Sports Premium Funding

During the academic year of 2013-2014, the Government introduced a Sports premium funding that is expected to continue until Oct 2021.

## What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150million per annum until 2021 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport; and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in school.

## Purpose of funding.

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport. The purpose of this document is to explain how Lytham Church of England School will spend the funding.

## How will we be spending the sports funding and who will benefit?

Schools are encouraged to offer a programme which includes high quality physical education as part of the curriculum; enough competitive school sport opportunities for those young people who want to take part, as well as activities designed to meet the needs of the least-active young people.

At Lytham Church of England School, the staff and governors agree that **all** children will benefit from the funding regardless of sporting ability; that children are given the opportunity to compete in sporting tournaments; and that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development.

Funding for the academic year from the sports premium was £16,000 plus an additional £10 per child on role. **Total = £17,930**

The remaining balance from the academic year 2019-2020 was **£2,429**

Total allocation for sports premium funding = **£20,359**
