Project 2 Extended, Architecture

Pupils will take part in workshop-style sessions to build confidence across a range of media, refining existing techniques while exploring new approaches. 

Project 1: Observe, Record, Create


Pupils will build on their investigative and analytical skills by studying natural forms such as shells, plants, bones, and insects. They will explore how artists from different times and cultures have responded to nature in their work. Through a range of media and disciplines, pupils will refine their techniques in line, tone, shading, form, proportion, and scale. Drawing from their research and observations, they will develop and design a series of creative outcomes. Pupils will also explore career links in areas such as scientific illustration, surface design, and environmental art, making connections between their artwork and the wider world

Pupils will explore their journey to school by observing and recording roads, buildings, and local landmarks. Using photography as a starting point, they will collect visual information and respond through drawing and design. Inspired by Aboriginal art and other cultural approaches to pattern, symbolism, and mark-making, pupils will learn how artists use line, colour, and composition to tell stories and reflect place. Building on previous skills, they will develop ideas, combine images and thoughts, and create a personal artwork using painting and mixed media. Pupils will also explore related careers in art, design, and architecture, making connections between their work and the wider world.

What is art? Project 1: The Art of Numbers

Pupils will explore how numbers, patterns, and shapes are used in art. They will learn about the formal elements—line, shape, colour, tone, texture, space, and form—while making links to maths through geometry and symmetry. Pupils will develop their drawing and design skills by creating artwork that combines number-based ideas with creative thinking. This project encourages careful observation, creativity, and an understanding of structure in visual art
