I'm thrilled to share some exciting news about the innovative learning strategies happening in our Y7 classrooms! As part of the "Teacher Walk Thrus" approach, our dedicated staff has been working on a fantastic strategy to enhance your child's skills. Some of our Year 7 students have been experimenting with a new technique called the "BUG" method, which links reading and comprehension skills to math. It's a simple yet effective approach: B – Box off the command words, U – Underline key information, and G - Give it a go! This method is designed to help our students better understand what is being asked of them and use their comprehension skills to efficiently extract information when answering questions. I am delighted to report that our students have embraced this strategy brilliantly. It's heartening to see them develop this skill and I am excited about the progress they will continue to make throughout the year. Education is an ongoing journey for both students and teachers alike, and it's wonderful to witness these moments of growth. Below, I've included a couple of examples from the students' work to showcase their application of the BUG method. It's a testament to the collaborative effort between our students and teachers in creating a positive and effective learning environment.
