
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Art and Computing Webinar with Aardman Animations

Free School Meals and Cashless Catering

If your child is entitled to Free School Meals, arranging biometric consent allows them to pay seamlessly at the till.

Please note that the daily credit (£2.60) is intended for lunch (meal deal), but some students choose to spend their balance at break time instead. While we will not restrict this (unless you request us to do so) - as we want students to eat if they are hungry-this may mean they have **nothing left for lunch**.

Any costs above the daily credit must be met by parents/carers via **ParentPay**. If needed, you can **top up** your child's meal account to ensure they have sufficient funds throughout the day.
