#### **Year 9 Remembrance Day Enrichment Day Reflection**

On Remembrance Day, our Year 9 students took part in a special Enrichment Day to develop their understanding of World War I. Through immersive activities, students reflected on the diverse experiences of individuals involved in The Great War, connecting with history in a personal and impactful way. Each student began by adopting a character from a specific region, representing the wide range of backgrounds and roles in the war. This unique approach encouraged them to view the war from new perspectives, imagining the lives of those who served on different fronts or supported from afar. Throughout the day, students engaged in various sensory activities that brought their


characters' experiences to life. A significant part of the day was dedicated to creating artwork inspired by them characters' stories. Working closely with both the history and art departments, students expressed their reflections through words and imagery, adding a creative and personal dimension to their learning. By the end of the day, students had gained a deeper appreciation of the diverse contributions to WWI and developed a newfound empathy for those who experienced it. #### Art Department Remembrance Ceramic Poppies


