- The art department have had a whirlwind first half term which saw several trips take place. We have already visited the Potteries Museum and Gallery, The Brampton Museum, The British Ceramics Biennale, a V&A Careers festival at Wedgwood and a very wet trip to the Yorkshire

Sculpture Park. Whilst we dry out from that we are working furiously with the Young Curators (a group of year 8, 9 &10's) to put together the exhibition of contemporary art at The Brampton Museum alongside ex-Madeley Pupil and Art Dealer Dr Jack Roberts. They have recently been handling famous art works from David Hockney, Tracey Emin and Eduardo Paolozzi to name a few. They've had workshops and meetings with Neil Brownsword a local artist and a PR professional who will be guiding them through all aspects of marketing this exhibition. This is getting very exciting so look out for adverts and posts with all the details to come.



We have also appointed 20 pupils across the year groups as Creative Ambassadors who will support the department through running assemblies, collating pupil voice, creating events, attending additional trips and workshops.

Meanwhile in lessons year 7 have been exploring the formal elements of art through history, mark making, shape and form all through the humble game of noughts and crosses. Year 8's are exploring portraits through a variety of artists, designers and photographers and have been busy pulling crazy faces, distorting images through apps, creating wire sculptures and will eventually move onto clay. Year 9 are exploring animals from endangered wildlife to our beloved pets and have been experimenting with mono printing, developing work into wire and will eventually paint and produce a 3d outcome of their choice. Year 10 are settling into GCSE life both in art and photography and enjoyed their YSP trip despite the rain. The photographer's had great fun in the studio last week light painting so follow the art Instagram page @artphotographymadeley over the next few weeks as some examples will be showcased on there. The artists have been working with clay and an awful lot of materials in response to the landscapes around us. Meanwhile our year 11 artists and photographers have been getting to grips with their final coursework unit and have been beavering away quietly.

This year looks to be an incredibly busy time in the art department.

 by all our nominees.


