Sparx Success This Term

Madeley students have shown incredible commitment to their Maths learning! Homework

completion has been outstanding, with Year 7 leading at 99% and Year 8 close behind at 98%, well above the school average of 95%. Across the school, students have completed 13,248 hours of personalised learning on Sparx Maths and answered over 1,506,091 questions correctly. Times tables confidence is growing too - 55% of students who used Times Tables have improved or are now considered confident. Fantastic effort from everyone - keep up the amazing work and let's aim even higher next term!

What is Bebras?

The Bebras Computing Challenge is an international competition designed to develop and test computational thinking skills - the ability to solve problems, think logically, and break tasks into manageable steps. These are essential skills for success in computing and beyond!



Well done to all of Year 9 who participated - you should all be very proud of yourselves.

The Computing Department is already looking forward to joining the competition again next year with even more students, as we continue to embed computational thinking across our curriculum.

A new initiative that has begun this term, is that all pupils have access on Showbie to their 'Cultural Passports' and a 'Creative Journal'. This gives all pupils the opportunity to reflect

and evaluate their cultural and enrichment experiences that they have taken part in, and record examples of creative activities completed across all departments. Pupils can complete a Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum Passport which will be awarded termly from the new year. Can I ask that you encourage evidence to be uploaded so that pupils have a record of their educational, cultural, and personal achievements that have broadened their experiences beyond academics please?

The two projects that have had funding this term for pupils are 'Clay Museum' in association with PMAG and the BCB and 'Design Lab Nation' with the V&A and Wedgwood.

'Clay Museum' runs weekly after school and pupils have visited the Potteries Museum and Art gallery and The British Ceramics Biennial at Spode. During the sessions they have made and designed plates, learning how to apply slip and transfers. Their work will be going on display next year at Gladstone Pottery Museum when they will be attending a Creative Careers Festival and completing their Bronze



'Design Lab Nation' is a prestigious national project; we are one of seven schools across the country who are taking part this academic year. Year 10 GCSE artists have visited Wedgwood, the V&A in Kensington and had a factory tour of 1882 LTD.



They have reimagined the iconic Portland vase, working with the ceramic designer Jacqui Ramrayka. There will be a celebration event next summer where their work will be on display at the V&A Wedgwood.



Earlier this year pupils took part in '80Candles for 80 Years' designing and making a candle holder for the **Holocaust Memorial** Trust. This has been in an exhibition on tour around the country and has recently been on display at Manchester College, it is now in Sheffield and will finally be on display in London in the new year.



Another project that has just been on display, from July to November, at the V&A Wedgwood has been the 'Ferdinand the Bull' ceramic project inspired by Arnald Machin and in conjunction with BCB.

What is bullying?

The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or online'.

Bullying can be:

- Physical pushing, poking, kicking, hitting, biting, pinching etc.
- Verbal name calling, sarcasm, spreading rumours, threats, teasing, belittling.
- Emotional isolating others, tormenting, hiding books, threatening gestures, ridicule, humiliation, intimidating, excluding, manipulation and coercion.
- Sexual unwanted physical contact, inappropriate touching, abusive comments, homophobic abuse, exposure to inappropriate films etc.
- Online /cyber posting on social media, sharing photos, sending nasty text messages, social exclusion
- Indirect Can include the exploitation of individuals
