RSHE is a compulsory element of the national curriculum for all primary and secondary schools in England. It is designed to help young people develop a secure understanding of healthy relationships, physical and mental wellbeing, and—at an age-appropriate stage—sex education. Updated statutory guidance published in July 2025 has further clarified expectations for schools, ensuring that content is delivered sensitively, accurately, and in line with students' developmental needs.

This upcoming session forms part of our wider commitment to preparing students with the knowledge and skills they need to make informed, responsible decisions as they grow into adulthood. The lesson will focus on factual information about different types of contraception, how they work, and how young people can access reliable advice and support. As always, the content will be taught in a respectful, age-appropriate manner.

In line with government guidance, schools are required to work closely with parents and carers to ensure transparency around RSHE. We are committed to strengthening parental engagement and welcome your involvement in shaping our approach.
