The Boy at the Back of the Class Onjali Q. Rauf

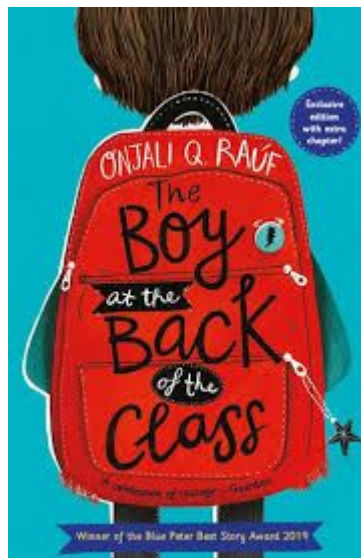
