He was the first official British astronaut to walk in space.</li> <li>Development in nursing/medical care</li> <li>Florence Nightingale was born a long time ago (1820)</li> <li>Florence Nightingale was a nurse and she saved the lives of many soldiers during war times.</li> <li>In 1854, Mary Seacole travelled to England. She wanted to help in the war but she was turned away because of the colour of her skin.</li> <li>Mary Seacole set up a hospital called the 'British Hospital'. Here, she cared for those who'd been wounded as they fought.</li> <li>During the War, Mary Seacole showed incredible bravery, even venturing into battle to help the soldiers by providing them with food, blankets and clothing.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Change and continuity: Events in time can be put into order of when they happened.</li> <li>Events can be explored and recorded in time in relation to other events around the world.</li> <li>Similarity and Difference: What characteristics are similar and what are different?</li> <li>Similarities and differences exist between people that lived in the past.</li> <li>Significance:</li> <li>Some events in history have a significant effect on people.</li> <li>Evidence: Handle evidence to ask questions and find answers to questions about the past.
