Bonjour (hello/good day/good morning), salut (hi) au revoir (goodbye), bon matin (good morning) Comment ça va? (How are you) Très bien (great), bien (good), comme ci comme ça (so-so/okay), mal (bad) Repeat sentences and make simple adaptations by answering 'how are you?' with their own choice from options Can you count to 10 in French? Zéro, un, deux, trois, quatre, cinq, six, sept, huit, neuf, dix Use the numbers for bingo, basic addition and subtraction (number bonds to 10), counting the number of people sat at a table group, counting objects How do you say yes or no in French?
