Title: What can be done to reduce Racism and can religion help?

Unit Overview	During this unit the children consider how religion can influence the beliefs of people and how this may help when tackling racism It allows children to discuss their thoughts and consider their own beliefs and form appreciative responses.	
Prior Learning/ Links	EY – Children learn about why everyone is special, and through PHSE will have learnt about different people, communities and families.  KS1/2 – During the RE units the children have followed they have studied different religious texts and have thought about what they say about treating people and the world with care. During PHSE lessons the children will have considered the local community and our diverse school community.
