Key Questions: How do we judge what is right and wrong? Are the 10 commandments relevant today? What do the stories from the bible tell us about religion?	<ul> <li>Children can talk about what makes a good role model.</li> <li>Children know that in the Christian faith, Jesus was an important inspiring person due to the actions he took.</li> <li>That Christians believe Jesus was a living person who sacrificed his life to save everyone.</li> <li>Children understand that the images of Jesus sometimes reflect the way Christians view him from the stories told in the bible.</li> <li>That there are stories in the bible which show Jesus could perform miracles. They can name the story of feeding the 5,000.</li> <li>Children know a key belief of Christians is that Jesus died on the cross in order to save human life. They then believe he was resurrected.
