Key Questions:  What are the different types of settlement?  What are the key features of Droylsden?	<ul> <li>That there are 4 countries in the United Kingdom: England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland</li> <li>To know a settlement is a place where people live.</li> <li>The main settlements are: city, town, village, farm.</li> <li>Children know some of the features of settlements: church, school, shops, roads, canal, river, transport.</li> <li>That some of the key cities in England are London, Manchester, Birmingham, Liverpool, Leeds, Newcastle.</li> <li>That a map is a drawing which can be used to see what is in a place. A map is drawn from a 'birds – eye' view.</li> <li>Children can follow a simple map and can explain what they are used for.</li> <li>The children will be able to plot a simple map from home to school.</li> <li>The children will recognise features of the local area: church, cemetery, supermarket, tram stop, park, houses.</li> <li>Children can compare two different types of settlement: town and village</li> </ul>	Investigating places: To name the countries of the UK. To state key UK capital cities. To understand what an aerial view shows. Can compare two settlements and state similarities and differences. To point out key landscape features: hill, mountain, coast, harbour, canal etc and state which are man –made and which are physical.  Investigating patterns:  Geographical skills and fieldwork To follow a map to navigate the local area. To use a map to identify key features of a town. To use maps and atlases to identify key areas in the UK, including cities and landmarks in the local area.  Communicating Geographically To present simple fact files about particular areas studied around the world.
