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## **CORONA VIRUS AND FULL SCHOOL RE OPENING SEPTEMBER 2020**

14.7.20

Dear parents/ Carers,

Below is a brief summary of what will be happening in September when we open the school to all the children.

It includes the process for entering school, what the days will be like for the children, and how the children will be picked up from school.

What I must make clear is that unless the government has reduced the alert level, and social distancing is no longer necessary, these measures will be in place.

In particular, the end of the day will be very busy. We will be limiting the amount of people on the playground, and parents will be asked to queue outside the school gates. This will feel very different, and is not how we usually operate. We love to chat to parents and have conversations on the playground but this will just not be possible when 400 children need to be picked up in a short space of time. We hope that everyone will be supportive of this. It is part of our risk assessment, and must be put in place. Changes like this can cause some frustration and upset as people don't like change or don't want to walk a few extra steps, but if parents and people picking children up begin to challenge staff they will be asked to not attend school at all. This is about everyone's safety.

These are very brief details, and are on a separate sheet so that they can be printed off and kept for reference.

If you would like to read the full re – opening plan, this is available on the school website. This has not been sent as it is 15 pages long and contains details about staffing and visitors, which will not apply to most parents and families.

I do hope the plan will reassure you of the safety of the children in school and in the community. Although we cannot 100% guarantee that everyone will remain virus – free, we are confident that the plans in place show how we are reducing any risks significantly.

We have now operated for 3 weeks with priority groups. School has had around 150 children and 40 adults operating on a daily basis. School feels happy, safe and the children are learning really well – We are so much looking forward to seeing everyone again ©
