What do Christians believe God is like?

Christians believe in God

Christians find out about God in the Bible

Creation

Causing something to exist

Creator

The maker; God

Human

A person

The Fall

The breakdown of the relationship between God and his people.

<u>Genesis</u>

The first book of the Bible

God the Creator cares for the creation, including human beings.

KS1 – Unit 1.2 - Creation

Who made the world?

The Bible tells a story (in Genesis 3) about how humans spoiled their friendship with God (the fall).

The Bible shows that God wants to help people to be close to him -he keeps his relationship with them.

God offers forgiveness even when his people keep falling short.

Humans cannot get close to God without God's help.

<u>Outcomes</u>

• Retell the story of creation from Genesis 1:1–2.3 simply.

Recognise that 'Creation' is the beginning of the 'big story' of the Bible.

Say what the story tells Christians about God, Creation and the world.

Give at least one example of what Christians do to say thank you to God for the Creation.

Think, talk and ask questions about living in an amazing world.

A special day when Christians remember and celebrate Jesus' birth

Mary

Jesus' mother

<u>Joseph</u>

Jesus' father on Earth

Advent

The four weeks before Christmas

Gospel

The teaching of Christ

Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby.

KS1 – Unit 1.3 – Incarnation

Why does Christmas matter to Christians?

Advent is when Christians get ready for Jesus.

Christmas is a time when Christians celebrate Jesus' birth.

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Outcomes

- Give a clear, simple account of Jesus' birth
- \cdot Recognise that stories about Jesus' life come from the Gospels
- \cdot Give examples of the ways in which Christians use the story of the nativity to guide their beliefs and actions at Christmas
 - \cdot Decide what they have to be thankful for at Christmas

Jesus was born in Bethlehem.

<u>Gospel</u>

The books of the Bible which are about Jesus' life.

<u>Belief</u>

Something that is true.

P<u>eace</u>

freedom; quiet, calm

Forgive

Let go of anger against someone.

Confession

Say you have done things bad things or made the wrong choices.

Disciples

Follower of Jesus

For Christians, this good news involves being loved by God and forgiven for bad things.

Christians believe Jesus' teachings make people think hard about how to live and show them the right way. Christians believe Jesus brings good news for all people.

KS1 – Unit 1.4 – Gospel

What is the good news Jesus brings?

Christians believe Jesus is a friend to the poor and friendless.

Outcomes

 \cdot Tell stories from the Bible and link with 'Gospel' or good news.

 \cdot Explain what Bible texts mean to Christians.

 \cdot Recognise that Jesus gives $% \left({{{\mathbf{F}}_{{\mathbf{F}}}} \right)$ instructions about how to behave.

· Give two examples of how Christians bring good news to their communities.

 \cdot Think, talk and ask questions about whether Jesus' good news is just for Christians or if there are things for anyone to learn.



Outcomes

- · Recognise that Incarnation and Salvation are part of a 'big story' of the Bible.
 - · Tell stories of Holy Week and Easter.
 - Recognise that Jesus gives instructions about how to live.
- Give at least three examples of how Christians show their beliefs at Easter.
- Think, talk and ask questions about whether the story of Easter has anything to say about sadness, hope or heaven.

KS1 – Unit 1.5 – Salvation

Why does Easter matter to Christians?

Easter is a very important part in the 'big story' of the Bible.

Christians believe Jesus died on a cross.

Christians believe that after three days Jesus came back to life.

Christians believe Jesus' resurrection gives people hope of a new life.
