It will be a wonderful opportunity to see the space for yourself and celebrate the hard work of our amazing FOMH team.



Government's emergency alert system-Domestic abuse victims

If you or anyone you know have a hidden or secret phone for your safety, please prepare for the upcoming UK Emergency Alerts test. Date:

Sunday 7 September 2025

Time: 3:00pm

During the test, all mobile phones and tablets will:

-Vibrate

-Emit a loud siren like sound (even if its on silent or vibrate mode)

-Display a message confirming that this is only a test and no action is required

This system is being tested to help keep people safe in future emergencies. However, for victims and survivors of domestic abuse, a sudden loud alert on a hidden phone could put them at a serious risk.

If you or anyone you know uses a concealed phone, for safety, please take steps to opt out of receiving emergency alerts before the test.

According to Merseyside Police, many survivors rely on these phones as a lifeline. It's vital that this alert does not compromise anyone's safety.
