



## <u>Primary/Infant/First Schools ONLY - Reception application process</u>

The application process for a reception place for September 2026 will open on 01 November 2025.

The easiest way for parents to apply is online. Further information can be found on <u>Admission to primary and middle schools - Staffordshire County Council</u>

The closing date is 15 January 2026.

## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION - ADMISSION INTO RECEPTION CLASS SEPTEMBER 2026**

To be sure of receiving an offer on national offer day please apply online through our website www.staffordshire.gov.uk/admissions.

The online system will ask for a UID number – please click 'No UID', this will allow you to continue with your application.

You will need to make your application by **15 January 2026** and your child will receive an offer of a reception place on national offer day 16 April 2026.

All the information you need about the admissions process within Staffordshire is available on our web pages.

- You must apply for all schools that you would prefer your child to attend including schools outside of Staffordshire or grammar schools. You will need to check the admissions arrangements for each school you are interested in to see what priority will be given to your application and whether you should provide additional information or a supplementary form with your online application. If you do not make an application your child will be disadvantaged as children whose parents/carers have applied will be given priority
- If you do not make an application your child will be disadvantaged as children whose parents/carers have applied will be given priority for popular schools.
- You must apply even if you have an elder child already attending the school (or affiliated Junior). No priority is given in the admission process because your child is currently in a nursery class and there is no guarantee that they will be allocated a place at the school at which they currently go to nursery.
- If there are other persons with parental responsibility for your child, who are not living at your home address, it is expected that you will jointly agree on school places before an application is made. The local authority is not able to intervene in disputes between parents over school applications and will request that these are resolved privately.
