

TOPIC

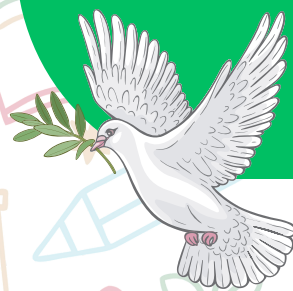
MATHS

SCIENCE

In science, we are exploring living things, specifically classifying big and small living things! We will define the term 'organism' and name the seven life processes of all living things and the term 'vertebrate' and name the vertebrate groups. We will also describe the work of Carl Linnaeus.

MUSIC
