Last week we were absolutely delighted and proud to be recognised as a PLATINUM AWARD OPAL SCHOOL. This honour is only bestowed to 0.5% of schools across the country and we are the first in West Cumbria and only the 2nd in the whole of Cumbria to achieve the accolade. A massive well done to our entire OPAL team for everything they have done.

We were also delighted to host a showcase school event where staff from other schools came to see our outstanding practice. It was lovely to hear all the positive comments not only about our provision but also about the children's behaviour, attitude and happiness.
