MEDICATION IN SCHOOL



If your child requires medication that has been prescribed by a doctor to be taken 4 times per day (therefore during the school day), a consent form **must** be completed. **The medication must be handed in to the office** and will only be accepted if it is in-date, labelled, in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and contains instructions for administration, dosage and storage.

Paracetamol, including Calpol, cannot be administered in school by staff.

It is not safe or acceptable for any form of prescribed or unprescribed medication (except inhalers or epipens) to be administered by a child or kept in their bag etc.

Inhalers and epipens must be regularly checked that they are in date.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP TIME SAFETY



Despite numerous reminders by newsletter, email and text, as well as posts on Facebook, we still have a number of parents/carers who continue to bring their vehicles up the school drive or park dangerously on Camp Road/Church Street. At the start and end of the school day, NO CARS ARE ALLOWED UP THE DRIVE FOR THE SAFETY OF EVERYONE. This includes dropping children at breakfast club.

If you need to come up to school in a vehicle, then please park with due care and attention and not on any zig-zags or on yellow lines.
