

HOME READING




From our 2 year olds to our Year 6s, reading at home is vitally important for every child. For our little ones, sharing a book is about the pictures, textures and the 'tune' of a story. Shared books then become about rhyme, repeated phrases and imagination. Once children become aware of sound-letter correspondence and learn to blend sounds together to form words, they want to share their reading and 'show off' what they can achieve. This doesn't mean they no longer wan to be read to - reading to your child opens up their wonder at how stories can come alive and also helps to develop their ideas and vocabulary.


Throughout school we have an expectation that parents and carers will both share books with their child as well as listen to them read (as age appropriate). Children in the infants will bring home weekly a book to share with a family member. These high quality books have been carefully selected for each year group with the aim that by the end of the year, everyone in the class will have had at least 30 books read to them at home.

Thank you so much for your support in this.



MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE

Mrs Mandy Penn is our Business Manager and Mrs Chris Freeland is our administrator. Both ladies work incredibly hard in the office to ensure the smooth running of the school. To help them out, please ensure the following -

- If you have changed your phone number, address or email, please let us know so we can update our contact details. We are required to hold a minimum of 2 emergency contacts for every child.
- All absences must be reported to the office by 8.30 on each day of the absence. The easiest way to do this is to leave a message on the answerphone. Where we have not had notification of an absence, this will be followed up by a text message, phone call or home visit.
- Dinners need to be ordered before 9am on the School Hub app. It is helpful if you order a weeks worth of dinners before each Monday. If your child is going to be absent, the dinner needs to be cancelled before 9am or you may still be charged.
- Breakfast club can be booked using the School money app. This costs £2 per day but is offered free of charge for those children who receive benefit related free meal provision.
