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#### COMMUNICATIONS PROTOCOL

Our school endeavours to ensure that communication between school and home is informative and consistent across all platforms we use. Below is an overview of the communication platforms we use and how each should be used by both staff and parents.

#### Parent to school communication

Parents are encouraged and reminded to use our various platforms appropriately. Please do not message staff directly via Tapestry or Seesaw as these platforms are not always monitored.
