MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE

Mrs Mandy Penn is our Business Manager and Mrs Chris Freeland is our administrator. Both ladies work incredibly hard in the office to ensure the smooth running of the school. To help them out, please ensure the following -

- If you have changed your phone number, address or email over the summer, please let us know so we can update our contact details. We are required to hold a minimum of 2 emergency contacts for every child.
- All absences must be reported to the office by 8.30 on each day of the absence. The easiest way to do this is to leave a message on the answerphone. Where we have not had notification of an absence, this will be followed up by a text message, phone call or home visit.
- Dinners need to be ordered before 9am on the School Hub app. It is helpful if you order a
 weeks worth of dinners before each Monday. If your child is going to be absent, the dinner
 needs to be cancelled before 9am or you may still be charged.
- Breakfast club can be booked using the School money app. This costs £2 per day but is offered free of charge for those children who receive benefit related free meal provision.

PE

PE is an important part of the school curriculum. Recent findings from the DfE found that-

'where schools provide high quality PE and pupils play sport, they equip pupils to continue that participation into their later lives. This goes beyond the immediate benefits of improved attainment, mental well-being and personal development.'

In order to participate safely and comfortably in PE sessions, we ask that all children wear appropriate

PE uniform which consists of -

- black shorts/leggings or joggers
 - white t.shirt
 - optional blue hoody
 - trainers

Please ensure your child comes to school in PE uniform on the following days -
