School meals

Unfortunately, we have been notified by our catering provider, Orian, that due to increasing wholesale prices the cost of school meals is going up. As from 6th June, the cost of a meal will be £2.50 per day (£12.50 a week) for children in years 3-6 and £1.80 per day (£9 per week) for Nursery children. Children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 will continue to access universal free meals.
