

SEPTEMBER 2024 MARYPORT CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL

Welcome back to the new academic year. It has been wonderful to see the children return and our new starters settling in so well. As I have visited each of the classrooms, there has been a lovely atmosphere around school with each class eager to engage with their new learning. This first newsletter of the year will contain important information about PE, Forest School sessions, wraparound care and much more.

Keeping in touch

Having a positive relationship between home and school is incredibly important and communicating effectively helps to keep everyone happy.

Please make sure that you inform us of any changes to your contact details - phone number or email so our systems can be updated and you do not miss any information.

Our newsletters come out monthly and the office will send out text messages or emails about any upcoming events that need your action. In addition to this, our Facebook page will also keep you up to date with all of our children's achievements and will also signpost to local events or support networks.

If your child is going to be absent from school, please inform the office, 01900 812299, of the reason and then do so on each day of any continuing absence. We ask that you do not use Tapestry or Seesaw for absence reporting.

Tapestry and Seesaw are used by class teachers to share with you any class information or work your child has done. Although you may comment on these platforms, they are not to be used as a form of official communication and a call or email to the office is recommended. Staff are not able to respond to messages immediately and may need to wait until the end of the day to get back in touch.

If you have a concern or query about anything at all, in the first instance, contact the office who will be able to answer your questions or pass your concern on to the most appropriate person. In most instances, it is advisable to speak about any concerns to the class teacher.

Wraparound Care

As from Monday 9th September, we are expanding our wraparound care offer.

Breakfast Club runs each morning from 8am and is open to all children in school. Children are provided with a choice of breakfast items and activities are available for them to play with. The cost of breakfast club is £2. Children who are entitled to benefit related free school meals do not need pay. Our new after school wraparound care is our 'Tree Tops' club which will run each week day during term time from 3.15-5.15. This is available for children from Reception through to Y6. The cost of each session is £7.50 and is part government funded to support working parents. We are therefore unable to offer any free places for this scheme.

To access Tree Tops', parents will need to initially register their child and then book the days they require at least 48 hours in advance. Home Reading

The importance of reading cannot be underestimated - the more a child reads, the more proficient they will become.


From the earliest of ages, it is vital that books are shared with children, listening to an adult tell a story introduces them to new vocabulary and the 'song' of the words.

Our youngest children in school will bring home books to share with their family and as they progress through Reception and our Read, Write Inc (RWI) phonics scheme, they will also bring home books that they can begin to read themselves.

Our 'strive for five' *initiative promotes home reading - we would like parents /carers to read or listen* to their child read 5 times across the week. Please take a quick minute to fill in your child's home school diary to let us know how you are getting on.

Attendance

As from the start of this term, new rules have come into effect around attendance. You may already have seen information on this in the press or online.

The Local Authority have recently appointed new officers who will be working directly with schools and families to support with attendance issues.

The new rules mean that the parents of a child who has 10 or more sessions (equivalent to 5 days) unauthorised absence in any 10 week period may be issued with a fixed penalty notice. The fine for school absence penalty notices across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. If you do not pay the fine you may be prosecuted in court.
