HUB SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN OF KEY

WORKERS – Hub schools have been set up across Cumbria to provide childcare for key workers. The Maryport Hub is based in Netherton Infant School and is staffed by volunteers from all of the local primary schools, ours included. There is a strict criteria to access this childcare as the prevailing message from the Government is still 'stay at home'. If you think you may qualify for, and need this childcare, please contact

FREE SCHOOL MEALS – As you are probably aware, the Government has announced that parents of those children eligible for benefit related free school meals will receive evouchers to cover the cost of these meals. Mrs Penn was ahead of the game with this and everyone who was entitled received vouchers before the announcement was made. In the coming weeks, the provider of the vouchers will change but we will keep everyone updated about this.

HOME LEARNING - We are very aware that a prolonged school closure is likely to lead to a significant lapse in children's learning and progress. This however is a national, even international, issue and children across the world are all in the same position. As a school, we will not (unless directed to by the Local Authority or Government) be conducting online/video lessons. Teachers will however be posting weekly learning tasks on the class pages of the website for children to complete at home. We recommend that, as a minimum, the children continue to read and do some maths based activities daily. In addition to this, please take advantage of being at home with your child to cook, play board games, get crafty and explore nature on your daily walk. We will also be continuing to signpost useful sites and ideas via our facebook page.

We are launching a TT Rockstars weekly event for all junior age children and each week we will announce the top scorer from each class on our facebook page.

As parents ourselves, we completely understand the challenges of getting children motivated and engaged in home learning – it is not easy! Please do not worry or stress about covering every task set, allow your child to have some choice in which activity they wish to do each day. Please do continue to upload photos and wideos to Tapostry (2's Nursery and

videos to Tapestry (2's, Nursery and Reception) and SeeSaw (Years 1-6) so staff can feedback to the children and hopefully keep them motivated. **KEEPING IN TOUCH** – Over the coming week, someone from school will ring for a catch-up. This is to keep in touch, check that everyone is ok and offer any support if we can. Where there are 2-3 children in a family, we will aim to coordinate it so you only receive one call. The call is likely to come from a withheld number so don't panic if this pops up on your phone.

KEY STAGE 2 RESIDENTIAL VISITS - Given the current circumstances, there will be no residential visits taking place this term - even if we do get back in before the summer holidays. The Y5 Edinburgh visit has been rearranged for October (for the same children) however the Y3 trip to Bassenfell Manor, the Y4 trip to Windermere and the Y6 visit to London have all been cancelled. Mrs Penn is currently communicating with the providers and our insurance company to arrange refunds. We greatly appreciate your patience and understanding at this is a very busy time for the companies involved and Mrs Penn will be in touch with everyone about this as soon as she can.

<u>UNIFORM</u> –Our uniform supplier is, like many other businesses, temporarily closed at the moment however we are confident that they will be back up and running to take orders within the next month or so. Please note that the checked pinafores cannot be ordered online as they require a minimum order of each size. The office will send out information about ordering these in due course.

<u>YEAR 6 SATs</u> – The Government has announced that all statutory testing and examinations are cancelled for this year. Although there is currently guidance published for teachers re GCSE and A Level grades, nothing is out yet regarding Y6 SATs. We are anticipating that teacher assessments will be requested at some point.

TRANSITION TO SECONDARY SCHOOL -

Should schools not reopen before the summer break, we will be in touch with our secondary colleagues to arrange transition days at some point before September. Year 6 children should by now know which secondary school they have been offered a place at and the school will have all of your contact details.

NEW STARTERS TO RECEPTION AND YEAR 3

Thursday 16th April is National Offer Day and anyone who has applied for either Reception or Y3 for September will find out if they have been allocated a place. This does not apply to children currently in our Y2 who will automatically move into our Y3. We are aware of a few Nursery parents who

have not yet applied for a place in Reception. They will need to contact school admissions directly at
