





FEEDBACK FOLLOWING PUPIL RESPONSE TO JOINING THE MATRIX TRUST

Following the pupil assembly on 7th March 2025 staff were tasked with supporting conversations with all pupils regarding how these 3 questions will impact on "The Elmwood Way". The questions posed were:

- 1. How will joining The Matrix Trust impact on me?
- 2. What are you worried about could change for you?
- 3. Is there anything you would like The Matrix Trust to consider for you?

Following the initial questions/statements made by pupils I had the pleasure of responding to these face to face ensuring that their voice was heard and responded to. Here are the final statements and responses collated across the pupil stakeholder engagement event:

How will joining The Matrix Trust impact on me? Pupil question/statement response.

Will the school name change? No, Elmwood School will maintain its name. We have worked hard to achieve a positive reputation. Is the school day going to change? No, the school day will continue as we know that this supports your needs more effectively. Will we have to eat lunches all together? No, we will maintain our family lunch settings, which makes Christmas all the more special when we all get together.

Will the class sizes be bigger? No, class sizes at Elmwood are between 6-8 and this is aligned to other SEMH schools and the DfE and Local Authority. It also fits our curriculum offer and access to off-site learning.

We will get better trips/experiences? Yes, there will be enhancements to what we already do i.e. Italy experience being a Gladiator, learn to sail like a pirate on a 100ft topsail schooner.

New equipment and better environment? Yes, new LED lighting across the school site to reduce the noise and prevent eye strain and headaches. Also brand new PC's for all pupils meaning we can access better programmes for our learning.

There will be more courses / qualifications? Yes, on an individual basis we will have access to other schools to participate in subjects that Elmwood don't typically deliver.

Staff will change? All staff who are working at Elmwood now will still be here when we convert as an Academy. Staff's terms and conditions will be protected and their jobs.

Our uniform will change to blazers, shirts and ties? No, our uniform will remain as this is aligned to your sensory needs identified within your EHCP as well blazers and ties being a health and safety risk for our practical curriculum.

What are you worried could change for you? Pupil question/statement response

Nothing will stay the same, as Mr Cross has shared that it won't. Correct, this was shared during the assembly and additional conversations with pupils.

Will our work be harder, more academic? No, the teachers at Elmwood will ensure that the work set will be aligned to your learning needs. However, we will always stretch and challenge you to be the best version of yourself and this is why we remain as one of the most successful SEMH within the Midlands.

Is Out & About, SULP, Votes for Schools going to be taken off the curriculum? No, as leaders we are extremely proud of our curriculum and how it stretches you academically as well as socially and emotionally. Our curriculum grows and develops with the changing cohorts i.e. introduction of Geography this year following pupil voice.

Is the building going to change? Yes, the environment/building will change for the better ensuring you are proud of how the school looks. The changes will be better for you and the future of Elmwood.

Nothing, as my previous school was an Academy and it made the school better. We are a Voluntary Academy Converter and have chosen to join The Matrix Academy as their ethos of Education without Exception aligns to "The Elmwood Way".

The Matrix Trust only has mainstream schools currently. This is correct, but their schools have a high percentage of SEND pupils accessing mainstream education. We as a school have a lot of expertise at all levels and this will support them in better meeting the needs within a mainstream provision. It also builds upon our working relationship of over 10 years in recruiting teachers and teaching assistants for Elmwood.

Will the schools behaviour systems and points change? No, the systems in the school to manage and track behaviour and celebrate your achievements will remain as these are suitable for our school.

The strike days are impacting on my education and wellbeing. I agree and this is something that leaders and those staff in attendance every day are working hard to mitigate. We are extremely proud that we have been able to maintain partial school opening which has significantly reduced loss of learning – especially for Year 11s as they prepare for their exams and BTEC coursework.

Staff leaving, as we have built positive relationships with them all during our time at Elmwood. All staff who are currently working at Elmwood will transfer over to The Matrix Trust on the same terms and conditions as they currently are. There are no job losses.

Pupils already in The Matrix Trust will have priority for places at Elmwood. No, there is a legal process in which the places at Elmwood are "owned" by Walsall LA and they request places from the Headteacher. It is the Headteachers decision as to whether we can meet the pupils needs and whether we have space for them within our groups. These decisions are based on the needs of the pupils and those already in attendance at Elmwood.

Is there anything you would like The Matrix Trust to consider for you? Pupil question/statement response

To build upon the school's current successes. I agree, taking the decision to join The Matrix Trust is very much around enhancing what we already do and to future proof the school for the future of Walsall children and their families with SEMH needs.

More equipment to play with in calm space, pupil request and break time. We have recently added sensory boxes and resistance bands on your chairs, but we will continue these discussions through School Council.

Bike park/ramps to help us ride better. We have utilised handmade ramps previously within the Out & About curriculum and look at using the surrounding environment to support biking.

Fishing Pool so we can maximise time on this. We have established a variety of contacts within the local area to ensure access to this as part of enrichment. We wouldn't explore at this time a creation of our own fishing pool as there is a lot of experience/expertise required to maintain a healthy environment for the fish and other wildlife.

Access to a music teacher for those that want it. There does seem to be a growing need around musical interest from pupils. This is something that we could explore as a tuition basis as there are still so many pupils whose sensory needs would be triggered by this curriculum enhancement.

Upgrade the Drama and Art room (facilities and environment). I agree, it would be good for school council to look at the facilities across the Matrix Trust to spark ideas for Elmwood and what would work for our space and delivery. Again, this can be discussed through School Council and our current teachers of Art and Drama.

FEEDBACK FROM PARENTS AND CARERS RE JOINING THE MATRIX ACADEMY TRUST

Building upon the schools' exemplary relationship with parents/carers (ratified by us maintaining our Leading Parent Partnership Award on 18.7.23), Leaders have completed a comprehensive stakeholder engagement through personalised 1-1 phone calls or face to face meetings with ALL parents and carers if your child is in Years 7 - 10. This approach has provided the school the opportunity to address some mis-conceptions and also listen to any concerns/questions they may have on a personal level regarding the decision to join The Matrix Trust from 1st September 2025. The key themes that were initially discussed were:

- 1. Did parents/carers watch the welcome video from The Matrix Trust?
- 2. Do they have any previous knowledge / experience of Academisation and the impact it had on their child?
- 3. Is there anything that you would like to know about Elmwood joining The Matrix Trust?

ALL parents/carers also had the opportunity to speak openly/honestly about the academisation.

Do they have any previous knowledge/experience of academisation and the impact it had on their child?	
Parent or carer question / statement	Response
71% have had previous experience of academisation regarding child's school.	 Positive experience at Primary School – it only added value to the school and my child's education. No negative impact on the school or my child previously. Sibling is in a Matrix Trust school and they have improved the school. Previous Primary school conversion was poor, but this was aligned to the school not having stable Headteacher.
29% haven't had any experience of academisation regarding their child's school.	 Experience within federation of schools, but this didn't really impact on the school / education of my child. Any change can impact on staff and children, but in time we did notice that this improved and in turn didn't negatively impact on child. I know you will always put the children first and my child has come on so well since being at Elmwood. I worry that leaders will leave the school to run other schools across the Trust. Leaders Response: Leaders at Elmwood will remain in post providing stability for pupils and staff.

Will class sizes get bigger	No, class sizes at Elmwood are between 6-8 and this is reinforced by the DfE, LA and Engage with our Future as well as the Headteacher. Physical classroom sizes also dictate how many children, adults and furniture we can have.	
Will the school become corporate with their uniform?	No, the uniform will remain as it is as we know this is supportive of the sensory needs identified within your children's EHCP. Also blazers and ties are a Health and Safety concern within Elmwood if a Physical Intervention is required as well as our Learning Outside of The Classroom principles.	
How long has The Matrix Trust been running?	Since 2014 and has been sensible with its growth of schools ensuring Education Without Exception (that is sustainable).	
The changes that The Matrix Trust are providing already sounds amazing for my child.	I agree, we wouldn't have been able to provide these enriching experiences and significant improvements to the environment. This will continue to grow and develop following academisation in September 2025.	
Will leadership still be the same as we need that consistency for the children.	Yes, leaders are committed to ensuring a smooth transition and are looking forward to making these experiences and enhancements to Elmwood possible. The Matrix Trust is equally excited to work with leaders, staff and pupils to ensure it happens.	
How are you going to reduce the impact of strikes on coursework / examination preparation?	Leaders are ensuring a modified curriculum is written weekly to ensure loss learning is addressed in the short / medium term. We are utilising experience days (with a curriculum focus) to capture key aspects of the curriculum that have been more affected and with specific groups. The Matrix Trust are supporting Year 11s in delivering Masterclasses for them. The school has already reached out to awarding bodies regarding the current situation — if extensions are required for their coursework.	

Additional comments / statements.

- I don't believe the school will change significantly other than more opportunities / experiences for my child.

 Leaders Response: I agree, this will open up many opportunities to develop academically as well as socially and emotionally.
- You always put the children first and you would not do anything to negatively impact on them. Leaders Response: Thank you for having faith and trust in us.
- I appreciate the conversation it has reassured me.
- I am relieved you have contacted me as the information in the media was misleading.
- When will the strike stop as this is impacting on my child? Leaders Response: Leaders and Governors continue to work in collaboration with the LA and DfE to resolve this current situation and I hope you can appreciate that we are working tirelessly to reduce the impact on your child.
- I think this will be the making of Elmwood, my child has been transformed since being at Elmwood and I can't wait to see how these additional enhancements will help.
- I believe that Elmwood is already outstanding so anything that can make it even better than that is brilliant for my child.
- Mr Cross wouldn't make a decision that does not ensure the best interest for our children.
- A carer has deleted the petition from their Facebook page as the information shared isn't factual and doesn't reflect the true picture.
- It looks like the curriculum could increase / improve for my child. Leaders Response: Yes, we want to provide a more formal pathway to access curriculum enhancements for our pupils (if appropriate).
