Transitions

Moving on after *Secondary School* or *Alternative Curriculum Provision* can be a daunting and confusing time for young people. Carlisle College have a dedicated Learning Support transition team who will help in any way they can to ensure a smooth transition from *School/Alternative Provision* to *College*. Assistance can include:

- Meeting students in *School/Provision* to talk about *College*
- Arranging individual *College* tours
- Arranging tasters in their area of choice at *College*
- Ensuring the right support is in place to facilitate learning
- Attending Year 9-11 reviews for students with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCP's)

Staff Expertise

- The Learning Support Team are skilled in teaching and supporting students with disabilities and have a range of expertise and interests in the field.
- In addition, when necessary, communicators/interpreters are provided by the *College* to support deaf or partially deaf students.

Cumbria Learning and Skills High Needs Study Programme	
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This programme is a partnership approach between Post 16 Education and Adult Social Care, managed and delivered by Community Learning and Skills (Cumbria County Council).

Community Learning and Skills works alongside day service providers to deliver an educational programme that is supported and reinforced by the day service provision - the educational element provides 16 hours per week.

The tailored partnership of education, care and support around each learner can lead to a wide range of positive outcomes - families usually report on increased confidence and independence at home. Learners' achieve meaningful qualifications which support employability, communication and independent living skills. Some learners' choose specific subjects such as maths and English or to support a vocational interest such as upholstery or food hygiene.

Learners' benefit from supported work placements, volunteer opportunities, community inclusion and enrichment activities.

Successful progression from the programme has included accessing mainstream Further Education, moving into employment, volunteering and supported living. Other real life advantages have included positive behavioural changes, some learners have moved away from the need for formal paid support, learners' creating independent social networks and mastering the skills to travel and work more independently within their local community.

Inspira provides careers information advice and guidance for young people with an EHCP from year 9 upwards. We work closely with schools and colleges to support transition planning, the help we provide is bespoke and tailored to meet individual needs and we welcome the involvement of parents. An Inspira Adviser would meet with the young person in school in advance of their EHCP review, in meetings, our role is to advocate on behalf of the young person and family. Inspira works with a range of providers and agencies to ensure that we can support young people and their parents/carers to prepare for adulthood.
