Mayfield Specialist School

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Mayfield School is an all age (3-19) School for pupils with severe and profound learning needs, we serve pupils and their families across the West of Cumbria. We are situated In Whitehaven, and our Post 16 provision is situated in Cockermouth. Some of the pupils also have autistic spectrum condition, sensory loss or physical difficulties. Our school offers all its pupils broad curriculum with a strong focus on personalised learning. Mayfield School is an inclusive environment where all pupils feel welcome and valued, where the teaching and learning, achievements, attitudes, and wellbeing of every young person matter. Our central ethos is to provide an outstanding education that supports all pupils towards their individual next step beyond School. Key to this is seeing every young person as an individual and building their education around their hopes and needs. Mayfield School believes that progress in the development of language and communication is central to the life chances of students with severe and profound learning difficulties.

The normal process for applications would be through the EHCP review process.
What type of placement is available at the school?	Pupils will attend Mayfield School on a full time basis. Although we work with families and health care professionals and multi agencies as appropriate
What kind of SEN provision is available at Mayfield School?	This is a specialist school for students aged 3-19 years with severe and profound learning needs. Students will be provided with an appropriately paced and differentiated curriculum, this reflects what children need to learn and how they need to learn it. At Mayfield School the students identified needs will be complex including severe learning difficulties, profound and multiple learning difficulties, autistic spectrum conditions. These may include sensory, physical or medical needs. The school supports all pupils not only with what and how they learn but also the environment in which they learn, this will change depending on your child's needs, but will also include access to specialist staff, rooms and outdoor learning.
What equipment and facilities are there to support young people with special needs?	Mayfield School is a fully equipped special school with hydrotherapy pool, sensory rooms, soft play room, independent living flat, cookery room, immersive room, specialist classrooms and an accessible outdoor learning environment.

What will my child learn at the school?	Every child is offered a broad and balanced curriculum that is appropriate
	to their age and ability, the curriculum sets out to answer what do our
	pupils need to learn and how do they need to learn, each child receives a
	personalised curriculum that is adapted to account for their needs and
	abilities. We have 3 curriculum pathways. All pupils are well prepared for
	the next stage of their education and life. There is a strong emphasis on the
	development of pupils' social interaction skills and on giving them the skills
	and knowledge that will allow them to live a good quality of life as young
	adults. Specialist approaches are used to support pupil's learning and these
	include:  • Communication and interaction including Makaton, symbol
	exchange, symbol support, intensive interaction, social language and



	computer supported communication • Physio, hydrotherapy, sensory assessment, regulation and processing • Vocational learning • Functional Maths and English

School?	Education, Health, Care Plan, as part of this we give you information on
	how your child is doing. We hold a parents evening twice a year so you can
	come and talk to your child's teacher. At the end of the summer term you
	will receive your child's report which highlights their achievement over the
	academic year. Every half term holiday, your child will have a new IEP with
	with a review on their last one. We encourage all parents and carers to talk
	to us if you have concerns, want to share achievements from outside of
	school or just want to ask how's my child doing. This can be done in
	person, on the phone or via Class Dojo.
How will my child's health and well-being be supported?	Children's emotional well-being is paramount to us, and we take great care to ensure that all of our pupils enjoy school and have positive learning
	experiences throughout their time with us. 8 Considerable emphasis is put
	on the teaching of Personal Social and Health Education and pupils are
	given many and varied opportunities to enjoy a range of Spiritual Moral
	Social and Cultural experiences during their time at school. Staff treat
	pupils with respect and have high expectations of them. Much emphasis is
	placed upon developing pupil's confidence and self-esteem and ensuring
	that all feel valued. Individual Behaviour Support Plans are used where
	there is seen to be an additional need these guarantee that all staff are
	consistent in their management of behaviour. There is a positive learning
	environment at school and staff provide excellent role models. School has
	an active School Council which allows pupils to express their views and
	those of their peers.
How are families involved in the education of their children?	At Mayfield School we understand that home plays the most crucial



	role in young people succeeding, we ask parents for their ideas for the best way of working their children and have an open-door policy so parents and carers can come and talk at any time.
What might my child do when they leave school?	This will depend on your child and what they want or need to do, part of our role is to support these decisions and needs. We fully support our children with their next steps, and our careers leads are exceptionally skilled and driven to secure the best possible steps for our children.
