It has been a fantastic half term, they say time flies when you are having fun, and this half term has flown! I want to start by thanking you for your support, I have been made to feel very welcome by our wonderful pupils, by our parents and carers and the staff. It is an absolute pleasure and privilege to be the Headteacher of Mayfield School.

This is the first of our half termly newsletters. Our daily use of Dojo provides a fantastic level of parent/school communication, and we have therefore selected to share a half termly newsletter. I hope you find Dojo a positive form of communication, if you do have any thoughts or questions please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher or a member of the Senior Team. As a reminder we have introduced a school wide approach to dojo working hours, these are set for 8am-5pm, as we want to ensure our staff have a positive work/life balance.



This academic year we opened our second site, so much hard work, planning and preparation went in to the opening of our St Joseph's site, this is in Cockermouth, and currently our KS4 and KS5 pupils attend here. As we continue to grow, this will be our Post 16 provision. The site is fantastic, it has been renovated to an incredibly high standard and has a wealth of resources to meet the needs of our children. The lunches in particular are a big hit! Our young people have transitioned successfully, as much as they have a strong pull to our Whitehaven site, they are happier in their new provision. It is in a fantastic location and the pupils are able to further develop their independent skills and can access the local community. We must say that we have been made to feel incredibly welcome, and in return we have welcomed the local Headteachers, representatives from a number of local employers and we have even welcomed the Lady Mayoress, we also welcomed our reception children who came to visit from our Whitehaven site, they were planning ahead about their future provision! Our older children were fantastic with our younger children. We will keep you updated with the continued developments. If you would like to visit do contact Stephen Chambers who will organise this.

The opening of our second site, releases facilities at our Whitehaven site, and our children have been able to utilise our resources in a greater way. Classes are using our food technology room regularly and the smell of baking lingers in the air. Our children are also developing their independent living skills and utilising our flat. It is brilliant to see the children hoovering and making the bed. We are so lucky to have the resources we have, with our soft play, sensory spaces, outside areas, swimming pool and the hall, our children can benefit from these areas weekly, if not daily.



We still have a nurse on site each day, and if you do have any medical concerns, please do not hesitate to make contact. When our new nurse starts permanently she will be keen to get to know as many parents as possible.

We have celebrated and achieved so much this half term, from Roald Dahl Day, to achieving the Gold Arts Mark Award, to puppetry theatre to ten pin bowling, with trips to Muncaster Castle and Whinlatter and Watchtree. Our staff work to provide a wide range of fantastic opportunities beyond the classroom and our children really enjoy the trips and visits, it really is a strength of the school.



This half term staff have completed a range of training courses, from moving and handling, to safeguarding and first aid, and we have been visited by colleagues from the Local Authority, we always receive compliments about our students and staff. We were also filmed for a national training provider, they asked and we were honoured to be involved.

There has also been a wealth of learning opportunities, my own knowledge of Castles, Kings and Queens and World War II has developed from visiting lessons. It is also a joy to see our children decoding and sounding out words with the excellent delivery of our phonics curriculum. I thoroughly enjoyed participating in a lesson where we critiqued the work of Vincent Van Gogh and I know Carolyn Westnedge was blown away by some of our children's writing and diary extracts. We do love to showcase and celebrate the learning around school.



I am looking forward to next half term, and I can't wait to be involved in the Christmas events.
