Some members of Lakes 6 received these special certificates and rosettes for taking part in a dance exam with Miss Zoe.





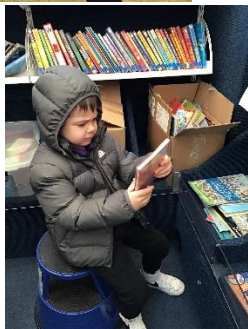
