Lakes 6 have been learning about where our food comes from. They read the story of 'The Little Red Hen', planted some seeds and baked some bread!





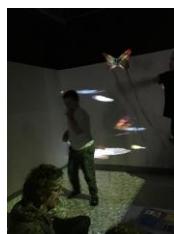
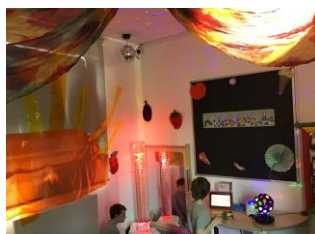
Lakes 7 had a fab time at South Lakes Safari Zoo, looking at all the animals.
