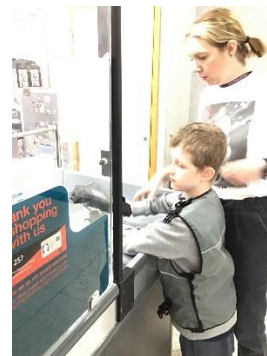
Within their RSHE topic for this term, Lakes 8 have been focusing on self-care skills. They have really enjoyed their weekly sessions of practicing these skills... very independent.
